





The newest X-Men installment promises plenty of slicing and dicing for everyone's favorite Canadian mutant.

Hugh Jackman wasn't the original choice to play Wolverine (a.k.a. Logan) in *X-Men*, which commenced filming September 1999 in Toronto. The role was first offered to Russell Crowe, who rejected it. Then Scottish actor Dougray Scott, who was hot off his role in the romantic drama *Ever After* with Drew Barrymore, was cast as Wolverine. However, when filming began on *X-Men*, Scott was still working on *Mission Impossible II* with Tom Cruise, which went over schedule.

Jackman took his place and shot to fame with his spot-on portrayal of the Canadian loner, Logan. Not only did he play the part well—getting the accent and attitude down perfectly—he also nailed the physical appearance of the rebellious mutant.

Other X-Men movies quickly followed—X-Men 2: X-Men United, X-Men 3: The Last Stand, X-Men Origins: Wolverine and X-Men: First Class. Despite the presence of popular mutants like Nightcrawler, Jean Grey, Professor X and Cyclops, it was Wolverine who drove the series forward and was a major character in all of the movies except for X-Men: First Class.

Jackman took a bit of a break from playing his blockbuster hero in between the Marvel films, demonstrating his

versatility as an actor. He provided voice work in *Happy Feet* and *Flushed Away* and worked on movies like *The Prestige, Australia* and *Real Steel*.

For his performance in *The Boy* from Oz on Broadway, he received

a Tony Award and then earned an Oscar nomination for playing Jean Valjean in *Les Misérables*. Thankfully for Marvel fans, old habits die hard; Jackman decided to return as everyone's favorite angry, adamantium-clawed mutant for the sixth time on the big screen in *The Wolverine*.

The movie, directed by James Mangold, who worked with Jackman on *Kate & Leopold*, is a sequel of sorts that takes place after the events in *X-Men: The Last Stand*. However, Jackman told slashfilm.com: "It definitely feels like a standalone movie in every way. I always hated the idea of saying *Wolverine 2*."

The idea for the film came from Marvel's 1982 limited graphic novel series *Wolverine*, created by Chris Claremont and Frank Miller. In the film adaptation, Logan travels to Japan, where he's offered the chance of a lifetime by a man he

once saved, to forgo his immortality. In the inevitable course of events, he runs into numerous foes and must fight for his life while at his most vulnerable.

The plot essentially continues the trajectory of *X2* by touching on Logan's past and its effect on his present. For

example, the new movie flashbacks to scenes in a WWII Japanese POW camp and will answer some more questions about Logan's life before he joined the X-Men.

Fans of the series itself will be pleased to know that a number of characters from the graphic novels appear in *The Wolverine*, including fighter and ally Yukio, as well as Mariko, traditionally Logan's love interest. Among his many opponents, Wolverine will face off against the deadly Viper and the heavily-armored, katana-wielding Silver Samurai.

Shot in Australia and Japan with a bevy of Japanese talent, the movie boasts ample action, including a bullet train fight. Fans of the *X-Men* franchise will be pleased to know that, although this is Wolverine's story, at least one other member of the team appears in the film: Logan's lost lady love Jean Grey will appear in flashbacks and dreams.

Jackman discussed her role in *The Wolverine* with MTV, saying, "She has a presence, which I think is vital to the movie, particularly for him confronting the most difficult thing within himself." According to Jackman, the new movie is darker than the previous films.

Along with crazy action scenes, there's also a fair bit of introspection; Wolverine has to deal as much with his inner enemies as those that attack from without. Those folks hungering for more mutants can catch Jackman again in *X:Men: Days of Future Past* next summer when he appears once more alongside his adopted family.



Elysium

Ccupy movement, in which protestors stood up against social and economic inequality, is still fresh in most people's minds.

In the movie, the gap between the rich and poor has widened so far that they don't even live on the same planet. A small number of wealthy humans live in a utopian world called Elysium, on an orbital space station. There's no sickness—they have machines that scan for disease and remove it if anything is found. Their peaceful world is beautiful and they live the life of the privileged. It's also the most heavily guarded place in the universe.

Meanwhile, the poor struggle to survive on an overpopulated, crime-ridden, rubble-covered Earth. The people who live there would do anything to get to Elysium. Matt Damon plays an ex-con who's dying and is desperate to get to the space station to obtain health care, while Jodie Foster plays a politician who wants to keep Elysium's habitat pure and save it, as she stated in a press conference, "from those pesky earthlings."

Damon says, "It certainly has a lot of relevance. Funnily enough, the whole terminology of the 99 per cent and the 1 per cent wasn't even there when we started." However, *Elysium* isn't all doom and gloom. Damon assures, "I think first and foremost, it will be really entertaining."

OMIC book movies have been HOT for the last couple of years—from *The Avengers* to *The Dark Knight Rises* to *X-Men* reboots and *The Amazing Spider-Man* films—and it doesn't look like the trend's dying out any time soon. Only one superhero has been missing in recent years—Superman—but that is about to change. The beloved superhero returns to the big screen in *Man of Steel*. Henry Cavill stars as Clark Kent (a.k.a. Superman), the infant Kryptonian sent to Earth, only to be adopted and raised in the quiet Kansas town of Smallville.

As the young man grows up, he understands his destiny to protect the world from evil and save mankind while keeping his identity a secret—posing as a newspaper reporter when not fighting crime.

Interestingly, Cavill is the first non-American actor to be cast as Superman in a feature film. Why the change? Director Zack Snyder explained in an interview with *GQ*: "He is very earnest," adding, "He does have a lot of the qualities that you would hope for in Superman. And they're not put on."

Man of Steel sticks to the classic trademarks and storylines of the *Superman* universe, but puts a new spin on it, using impressive special effects and making it more relevant for new audiences.


THE MORTAL INSTRUMENTS: CITY OF BONES

Lily Collins was cast in the lead role as Clary, a teen who finds out she has special powers when she realizes she can see people who are invisible to everyone else. When her mother is attacked and goes missing, Clary goes on a quest to find her.

Did you think, "This is my role" when you read the books?

No, I was just a fan, but I saw a lot of similarities with Clary because my mom and I are best friends. If anything ever happened to her I would do anything to get her back. So when I was approached about it, it was really special because I was a fan becoming an actual character in a book.



I did three months training with a physical trainer before the film. We did close combat fighting, practicing with reactions and falls and all that. It was mainly a lot of physical training but I also read the book again, to really go over Clary's voice.



LILY COLLINS

■ What was it like having Jonathan Rhys Meyers play your dad?

Jonathan is so talented, it ups your game. You know, he intensified all of us and brought new things out of us, especially for Clary's character. He would improv a line when I wasn't expecting it, to scare me. It did scare me but then between takes he's like, "Are you okay? Let's work through this, let me fix your hair." He's a lovely man and he's the perfect choice for Valentine.

■ How about Jamie Campbell Bower?

I can't explain the feeling when you just know that person has to be cast as this particular person because they share every quality that character has. Jamie is such an amazing actor and we all have so much fun. When we're not shooting, we're just playing around, just joking and laughing. But I'm really excited for everyone to see what Jamie can bring, especially because of the backlash he got from fans when he was cast. I truly believe there's no one else that could have played it like him.

JAMIE CAMPBELL BOWER

Jamie Campbell Bower plays Jace, a Shadowhunter who protects humans from demons. He becomes romantically involved with Clary as he helps her search for her mother.

■ Had you read the books?

I hadn't read the books when I first saw the script. But once I read the script I automatically connected with the character.

■ Could you talk about your bond with Lily Collins?

I can! We did the chemistry test together and immediately there was this sort of raw connection. There's this connection I have on camera with Lily, which works so well and makes it so easy to go to work every day.

■ How do you know when chemistry between actors works?

People can see it. I think it was one of the big reasons that I was put in this role, because at the time I went for the screen test, physically I wasn't the image of who the character is. I think they saw a connection between us and they were like, "That's it! They are the characters."



■ What is the hardest part of Jace's character?

I love him because he's so rude. He's such an asshole and I love that. And that's what I have the most fun with. It's very rewarding to explore different sides of a character.

■ Did you bulk up a little bit physically?

I actually slimmed down quite a lot. I was a big boy. I was a fat guy. There was no muscle on me at all so I went into the gym three months before and sort of toyed

around with different body shapes. Then I made the decision to really slim down; really tone up—there's not an ounce of fat on this guy because there was a scene in the book where they're eating and he just doesn't eat.

■ Does the tattoo work take a long time?

Yeah. I've got real tattoos that had to be covered up and then put other ones on top of that. It's a good three hours in the chair but it's fundamental to who the character is and it helps me get into that space. The costume, the makeup, that half hour in the morning when you're sitting on your own and putting stuff on is the time that you have to be able to slip into character.

Buzz: Goodman and Crystal recorded their lines together in the same room so they could get the right chemistry between their characters.





CLAUDIA LEE in *Kick-Ass* 2

Rising star dishes on being part of the A-list cast of *Kick-Ass 2*

Claudia Lee found fame after landing a starring role on the hit television series, *Hart of Dixie*. She'll be making her big screen debut playing Brooke in the action comedy sequel *Kick-Ass 2*, alongside an A-list cast including Chloë Grace Moretz, Aaron Taylor-Johnson, Jim Carrey and Nicolas Cage. *Tribute* chatted with the young star to find out how "kick-ass" the experience really was.

■ How would you describe your character in the film?

I play Brooke; she's Mindy's nemesis. Brooke is introduced in the *Kick-Ass 2* movie in Mindy's school life and she's very manipulative—she can manipulate people in order to get what she wants. She is in charge—you don't want to be on her bad side. She's a really fun character to play and I've been searching for a role like

this for a long time. When *Kick-Ass 2* came out, I was like, "Oh my gosh, this is perfect!" It's so different. It's so dynamic.



Were you a fan of the first *Kick-Ass* movie before you took on this role?

I'm a huge fan of *Kick-Ass!* And also I love all the comic books. I know this kind of sounds nerdy but when I was younger, my cousin and I would read them over and over again, so I totally grew up with that.

■ How did you land the role?

I was taking a holiday in the summertime and they wanted to see me so they asked, "How about if you send a tape? Wait, no. We really want to see you in person." I guess things work out when they're meant to be. I'm just so glad they picked me because I really fell in love with this character. She's such a cool, edgy character.



We were working at a school in Hamilton [Ontario] and it's the same school they filmed at when they did the

first *Kick-Ass*. Aaron [Taylor-Johnson] is very cool. I love his work. I really respect him as an artist because he's so good at his craft. And I love Chloë; she and I hit it off like BFFs, like we knew each other for so long and we all had such a great time. It's really a wonderful group of people.

■ How did they work Nicolas Cage's character into the sequel?

It's a flashback scene involving Chloë's character, Mindy. But I think it's great that he's coming back because his work also is so phenomenal. The first *Kick-Ass* with him was super cool; Big Daddy was such a cool character. And his relationship with Mindy was so well received.



UMMER wouldn't be complete without a monster movie. This year, it will be provided by scare-meister Guillermo del Toro. Del Toro is at his creative best when he's flexing his monster-making muscles-remember the Pale Man from Pan's Labyrinth? For Pacific Rim, he's crafted Kaiju: geologically-inspired creatures as tall as buildings that look like a mix between the Balrog from The Lord of the Rings: The Fellowship of the Ring and Jabba the Hutt's rancor.

They rise up out of an inter-dimensional portal in a crack in the Pacific Ocean and wreak havoc on human civilization. In response, humans produce equally monstrous robots called Jaegers, which are controlled by two mind-linked pilots - but even these can't stop the damage. As a last response, the armed forces of the world call on a former pilot (Charlie Hunnam) and a trainee (Rinko Kikuchi) to operate a legendary Jaeger and stop the Kaiju once and for all.

This is del Toro's most colossal project ever. At Wondercon 2013, he described the scale of the production. For some scenes, they built a Jaeger head, several stories high and completely mechanized. When speaking about his affinity for monsters, the director told Tribute, "If you gave me a full scholarship to design monsters the rest of my life, that's what I would do because I do think there is a whole world of monsters in my head since I was a kid that is waiting to come out."



HEN you're dead, you're dead, right? Not necessarily. Not in R.I.P.D., better known as the Rest In Peace Department. This 3D supernatural action/adventure, based on the Dark Horse comic, brings together a charismatic cast, featuring Ryan Reynolds, Jeff Bridges and Kevin Bacon.

During a stakeout gone wrong, police officer Nick Walker (Reynolds) is shot and killed. He's summoned to heaven by Proctor (Mary-Louise Parker) and enlisted in the undead police division to track down the man who

murdered him and protect the living world from evil spirits who refuse to cross over to the other side.

The recently deceased cop is teamed up with another ghost—wise-cracking Roy Pulsifer (Bridges), a grizzled Old West Sheriff. His job is to teach the rookie to defend the world, one soul at a time, by capturing destructive men and women hiding among the living and sending them packing for the afterlife.


Complicating matters, the two ghost cops don't look like themselves to the outside world. Walker's appearance takes

a radical change as he transforms into an old Chinese man, while Pulsifer morphs into a stunning blonde bombshell.

The fun comes from watching the hilarious dialogue between Reynolds and Bridges as they uncover a plot that could destroy life as we know it, and must find a way to restore the cosmic balance. It's also entertaining to witness dangerous stunts and accidents, knowing the undead cops can't be injured because they're already dead.

Contrary to popular belief that death may be the end, for Walker and Pulsifer, death is only the beginning.
