AN UNEXPECTED JOURNEY

Return to Middle-earth as Peter Jackson brings us the first film in his new trilogy

Jackson's previous film adaptations of the J.R.R. Tolkien novel *The Lord of the Rings* proved to be a massive success. The film franchise was not only a hit with moviegoers, but *The Lord of the Rings* series was also nominated for 30 Academy Awards, taking home 17 of the precious golden statues. This time, Jackson is tackling Tolkien's children's book *The Hobbit*, a prequel of sorts to *The Lord of the Rings*. Released in 1937, *The Hobbit* tells the story of home-loving Bilbo Baggins as he embarks on a quest to take a share of the dragon Smaug's treasure.

Don't be surprised if you recognize a familiar face or two when the epic fantasy film hits the big screen this holiday season. Several cast members from *The Lord of the Rings* franchise were happy to reprise their roles. Sir Ian McKellen and Christopher Lee return as the wise Gandalf the Grey and Saruman the White, while Elijah Wood, Orlando Bloom and Andy Serkis will play Frodo, Legolas and the unsettling Gollum once again.

While plans to begin production on the film started back in 2006, Peter Jackson was apprehensive about directing, feeling it would lead to an unfair comparison to his previous work. Mexican director Guillermo del Toro was attached to the project and worked to develop his vision of the story for two years before revealing to a Tolkien-based website that he would no longer be directing the project.

"In light of ongoing delays in the setting of a start date for filming *The Hobbit*, I am faced with the hardest decision of my life," del Toro wrote. "After nearly two years of living, breathing and designing a world as rich as Tolkien's Middle-earth, I must, with great regret, take leave from helming these wonderful pictures."

In late 2010, Peter Jackson was confirmed as the director, an announcement that had both Jackson and fans excited about the prospects of the new franchise.


“Exploring Tolkien’s Middle-earth goes way beyond a normal filmmaking experience,” Jackson said during the official announcement of his new role. “It’s an all-immersive journey into a very special place of imagination, beauty and drama.”

With Jackson at the helm, the project began moving forward in great strides. *Sherlock’s* Martin Freeman and Benedict Cumberbatch were soon confirmed as the actors playing the hero Bilbo Baggins and the villainous Necromancer.


But Jackson is bringing more than just some fresh faces to the table this time. *The Hobbit: An Unexpected Journey* will also be the first movie to be filmed at 48 frames per second, twice the regular frequency that most movies use. It’s a technological innovation that could change the entire film industry.

“Looking at 24 frames every second may seem ok—and we’ve all seen thousands of films like this over the last 90 years—but there is often quite a lot of blur in each frame, during fast movements, and if the camera is moving around quickly, the image can judder or ‘strobe,’” Jackson explained on his Facebook page. “Shooting and projecting at 48 fps does a lot to get rid of these issues. It looks much more lifelike, and it is much easier to watch, especially in 3D.”

With *The Hobbit: An Unexpected Journey* hitting theaters December 14, and the sequels—*The Desolation of Smaug* and *There and Back Again*—expected to be released in 2013 and 2014 respectively, it looks like it’s time once again to get comfortable in the Shire. Tolkien and Jackson’s amazing world is here to stay.



With Tom, you'll get 100 per cent of Reacher with 90 per cent of the height."


Emma reunites with Ryan Gosling in the upcoming 1940s crime drama *Gangster Squad*

Fun Fact: In the '40s, gangsters' girlfriends were called molls.








New Moon



able to sustain over five years with the same amount of enthusiasm as when we first started is because the story lent itself to that. So as soon as you are finished telling the story, you do kind of miss it.


Most memorable experience?

It's brilliant and anyone seeing this movie must stay through the credits.

It's really weird, I don't know why but it has a very powerful effect on you.

So being the expert you are after having played Edward for so long, how did Kristen cut it as a vampire?

She's pretty good! (laughs) It's unfair because she actually got to revel in the physicality of the role whereas even in the first one Edward's already jaded. He's so over it (laughs). He's bored of being a vampire.

Is there anything you want to say to the fans?

Thank you guys so very, very much for all of your support. You have really driven this series to become what it is and I sincerely hope that you all like *Breaking Dawn 2*, it's kind of all about you guys anyway. So thanks, and I hope you like it.

What was it like to hear "It's a wrap" for the last time?

I remember it vividly. The last scene I shot was with Kristen and it was a scene in *Breaking Dawn – Part 1* because we shot both films at the same time. It was the slow dance scene between Jacob and Bella at Edward and Bella's wedding. It was emotional, and it didn't help that it was an emotional scene on top of that but I remember looking at Kristen and saying, "This is it." Hearing "cut" for that final time was kind of scary. It was sad.

THE HUNGER GAMES: Catching Fire

The Capitol announces that 24 winners of the previous Hunger Games, including Katniss and Peeta, will be forced to compete again in the 75th Hunger Games. *The Hunger Games: Catching Fire* will be in theatres November 22, 2013.



inspires me right now. Her work in John Cassavetes' films in the '70s was ridiculous—*A Woman Under*


the Influence is my favourite film. So it's that kind of quality of performance that I'm really turned on by.





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A Tribute to the Academy Awards



Les Misérables

With the movie industry's most prestigious awards ceremony quickly approaching, we'd like to take this opportunity to pay tribute to the Academy Awards and give you a peek at who we think will receive a nomination!

But first let's take a look back—the Academy Awards debuted on May 16, 1929 at the Hollywood Roosevelt Hotel with 270 people paying \$5 each to attend.

By 1942, attendance had grown to such an extent that the affair was moved to Grauman's Chinese Theatre.

In 1953, the Oscars were first broadcast on television, allowing millions in the U.S. and Canada to watch the glamorous event. Prior to that, the ceremony was broadcast on radio, with highlights shown via news reels at cinemas.

In 1969, the newly-built Dorothy Chandler Pavilion in Los Angeles became the new venue for the ceremony.

Since 2002, the awards have been held at Hollywood's Kodak Theatre, which was renamed the Dolby Theatre this year. The Academy Awards are seen via satellite in over 200 countries around the world and in 2013, the 85th Oscars, which will broadcast live on February 24, will be hosted for the first time by Seth MacFarlane.

Oscar Contenders

Les Misérables is definitely a front-runner—it should get multiple nominations.

Silver Linings Playbook and *Argo*, both of which premiered at the Toronto International Film Festival, are definitely going to be recognized by the Academy.

Other films on Oscar radar: *Life of Pi*, *The Master*, *Flight*, *Zero Dark Thirty*, *Lincoln*, *Moonrise Kingdom* and *The Best Exotic Marigold Hotel*. Nominations will be announced January 10, 2013.
