





BATTERS UP!

Brad Pitt throws a curve ball as manager Billy Beane in *Moneyball*.

In baseball, there's a commonly held belief that only the richest teams win championships - namely the New York Yankees. And yet, in the last ten years, the Yanks have only won the World Series once.

Moneyball tells the true story of a baseball manager that defies the theory that you have to spend big to win big. Brad Pitt stars as Oakland Athletics general manager Billy Beane, who managed to create a winning team with a budget that would barely cover the cost of chauffeurs for the Yankees. Beane's system offered a ray of hope for low-budget professional teams (and their fans) from all major sports.

Early in the film, Beane has a frank assessment of his team. "There are rich teams, then there are poor teams, then there's 50 feet of crap, then there's us." Helping out Beane is assistant general manager Peter Brand, played by Jonah Hill. Brand buys Beane's theory that no money doesn't necessarily mean no victories. The trick is to find skilled players who aren't high-priced stars. "I believe there is a championship team that we can afford because everyone else undervalues them," says Brand in the film.

Of course, changing long-held beliefs in a game as traditional as baseball is no easy feat, which is what gives this story its unique slant. Many baseball purists railed against Beane at the time, but then later embraced his system. In his own way, Billy Beane changed the face of professional sports.

If you're not a baseball geek, here's Billy Beane's system in a nutshell: Instead of paying big salaries to players with high batting averages, you get players who get on base a lot (high "on-base percentage"). The distinction seems like a minor point, but when you're dealing with millions of dollars in salaries on a small-market team, it could very well mean the difference between a team making the playoffs or being eliminated early. Just like any budget, whether it's a corporation or a sports franchise, the idea is to get more bang for your buck.

Rounding out the all-star cast is Robin Wright, Oscar winner Phillip Seymour Hoffman (as manager Art Howe) and Stephen Bishop as superstar David Justice (who, of course, is the ex-husband of Oscar winner Halle Berry). Directing the film is Bennett Miller, best known for helming *Capote*. Jonah Hill's character is based on real-life baseball man Paul DePodesta, who was excited about gathering eager but underappreciated players on one team "like an island of misfit toys."

The script, based on the bestselling book by Michael Lewis, is written by Oscar winners Steve Zaillian



(Schindler's List) and Aaron Sorkin (The Social Network).

As for Pitt, his experience with the game is limited to playing with his sons – and one rather unfortunate event from his younger days. "I knew very little about baseball apart from taking one in the face in junior high," he told *USA Today*. The gash required 18 stitches and left a scar.

But the superstar actor still threw himself into the role – and was helpful to at least one of the younger actors on the set. Former baseball player Casey Bond, who plays one of the Athletics, recently told Hollyscoop.com that Pitt was great to work with. "He was an awesome guy," he told *USA Today*. "He was like a mentor on the set. He gave me advice every day." Bond was amazed at how "surprisingly normal" Brad and Angelina are. "A lot of people think they would be a big celebrity couple, which they are, but they are some of the most normal people I've ever met."

INTERVIEW

NOT YOUR AVERAGE

Joseph Gordon-Levitt mixes drama with a twist of comedy in his new movie 50/50.

oseph Gordon-Levitt is every director's dream. Not only is he "that guy everyone loves," but he's also one of the few actors of his generation that fits seamlessly into any role he tackles. From playing a teenage hustler in Mysterious Skin to the charming romantic guy in 500 Days of Summer to a mind thief in the blockbuster Inception - Gordon-Levitt has become successful and famous for his charm, talent and versatility.

In his upcoming film 50/50 (written by Will Reiser based on his true-life experience), Gordon-Levitt takes on a dramatic role as a man who finds out he has a rare form of spinal cancer. But with the help of Seth Rogen (his best friend), Anna Kendrick (his inexperienced therapist) and Bryce Dallas Howard (his somewhat inconsiderate girlfriend), Gordon-Levitt and cast turn this depressing subject matter into a lighthearted film that's not only real, but funny.



You've managed to make that successful jump from child actor to a successful adult career. Are you conscious of that? Gordon-Levitt: Yes, thank you. There was a time for a while after I was done doing 3rd Rock from the Sun where no one wanted to put me in any movies and I was very worried and depressed about it. But I really have to give credit to a few filmmakers who took a chance on me early on. At the end of my run on 3rd, Jordan Melamed, who made the movie Manic, cast me, and Manic was the movie Gregg Araki saw and then put me in his movie, Mysterious Skin - which Rian Johnson saw and put me in his movie Brick. When people saw Gregg and Rian's movies they started to believe I could do some acting besides teen comedies or sitcoms - not that there's anything wrong with teen comedy. I've had a lot of great experiences in that genre/format.

What was the appeal for you to star in 50/50?

Gordon-Levitt: This piece of writing is by a guy named Will Reiser, and this is his story. He actually did survive cancer and he is also a really funny guy. He runs with this funny posse of dudes, including Seth, so it only made sense after going through this horrible ordeal, they would convince him to write a funny movie about it, and I actually think it's a really healthy response.

Were you at all concerned about how you would portray him onscreen?

Gordon-Levitt: Yeah, it was great just to have him there; you know, not every movie has a screenwriter there onset while you're doing it. Will was on the set there all day, so that was a great resource for me. Talk about researching an actual character! I just had to hang out with the actual guy, and I did hang out with him all day while we were shooting and we would talk about every scene and how it felt, why it was funny but also what it meant to him on other personal levels as well.

Were you at all nervous about buzzing your hair for this? Gordon-Levitt: That was our first day of shooting and I wouldn't call it nervous, but there's always that wave of anticipation and energy that comes with the first day of shooting. So it was a fantastic scene to do first. To do something like that - and it's true mostly with shooting movies, you have to be sort of safe, you have to sort of be able to repeat it and it's rare that they shoot something where they're like, "Well, we can only do this once and hope we get it," and that's what it was. Me and Seth actually shaved my head.

You've done some small films, but also big films like Inception, and you're now filming The Dark Knight Rises. Which do you like better?

Gordon-Levitt: Well, for me it isn't so much about the size of the movie. I just want to work on stuff where I feel creatively inspired, whether it's a movie like 50/50 or The Dark Knight Rises - they're both creatively inspiring. Yes, it's true, the movie I am working on right now is a huge, huge, huge movie and 50/50 is a smaller movie, but I guess I have eclectic taste. I take equal inspiration from them both.

yan Gosling is like a first love. You never forget the first time you laid eyes on him. The Cornwall, Ontario, native made his swoon-worthy mark in 2004 with The Notebook, winning the hearts of women everywhere. He made *People's* 50 Hottest Bachelors list and picked up every teen liplocking/couple award possible. Not a bad year. But then, instead of doing the expected and making a blockbuster comedy, Ryan chose to do Stay with Ewan McGregor, followed by Half Nelson, Lars and the Real Girl, and Blue Valentine, all off-thebeaten path roles and films. Each one garnered him dozens of award nominations and wins, proving he's not only one of the greatest actors of his generation, but one who's able to choose the right roles for himself.

"There is this idea in Hollywood, and I've seen it work for people, where the unspoken rule is 'Do two for them and one for yourself," Gosling has said. "And that's kind of considered a fact. I've never really found that to be true for me. I've gotten more opportunities out of working on things I believed in than I ever did on things that weren't special to me."

So when the opportunity to do a comedy – the *right* comedy – came along, Gosling took it, much to the surprise of fans and critics alike; he'd never done a comedy before. "After *Blue Valentine* I had to go to the doctor for a physical and when I left he gave me a prescription," Ryan told the *Globe and Mail*.

"He wrote, 'Do a comedy.' So I did."

Doing a comedy could have been the worst decision of his career. But it wasn't. *Crazy, Stupid, Love* was a success, and so was Gosling as a smooth-talking womanizer opposite Steve Carell. More smart choices followed with his next two films, which will show at this year's Toronto International Film Festival: *Drive* and *The Ides of March*.

In *Drive*, Gosling plays "Driver," a car stuntman

turned wheel man for gangsters by night who gets double-crossed when a deal goes wrong. "The whole project was charmed in some way," Gosling has said. "One of the producers, Marc Platt, said to me, 'I'm never going to send you a script you won't want to do. When I send you something I promise you're gonna want to do it.' Then a year later he sent me *Drive*; the second I finished reading the script I called him and said he was right." Of course, he falls in love with his neighbour, who happens to be Brit darling Carey Mulligan.

Gosling then slides into a totally different role in *The Ides of March*, directed and co-written by George Clooney based on the play *Farragut North*. Gosling plays a press secretary who falls prey to dirty backroom politics as he works to get his candidate (Clooney) elected in a tight race. While Clooney

In Drive, Gosling plays a stuntman by day and getaway driver for gangsters by night.

plays the politician, Gosling is the star of the film, despite an all-star cast that includes Oscar-winning actor Philip Seymour Hoffman, Paul Giamatti, Marisa Tomei and Evan Rachel Wood. The film marks Gosling's third of the year, with three more in the works.

"I've learned it's important not to limit yourself," Gosling has said. "You can do whatever you really love to do, no matter what it is." This is interesting, coming from the actor who told *Tribute* earlier this year that he never really wanted to work. "Every time I made a movie it just made me sick to my stomach, and I tried to do it as little as possible. But I've had a few really good experiences lately, so I'm feeling better about it, so I guess I feel like I'd like to work more."

We're glad he does, too.









Dustin Milligan is leaving the 90210 teen drama behind for an intense showdown with some fierce creatures in Shark Night 3D. Here, the Canadian star talks about filming his new thriller, what it was like filming with mechanical sharks, and being the "hot guy."

Has 90210 opened doors for you?

Milligan: Oh, without a doubt. It's certainly the largest audience I've been exposed to so far. That kind of show was so much fun to work on, and to be a part of that sort of hype and hoopla, it was quite exceptional for a northern Canadian boy like myself.

How cool is it to be in a movie like *Shark Night 3D*? Milligan: Being from Yellowknife, to have been shooting in Louisiana in the swamps, in the water with mechanical sharks for two months, was unreal. It was unbelievable. I've never done a thriller like this, and I've never done a sexy beach movie like this and certainly never have punched sharks in the face!

It doesn't hurt to be sexy in a movie, to be known as the "hot guy."

Milligan: Well, they're certainly going to try to portray me as such. I'm quite confident that my true dorky nature will inevitably peek through.

When you first read the script, what was it about it that really grabbed you?

Milligan: It's a lot of fun and I think that's what audiences want to see in a shark movie. People die, but it's exciting, it's intense and it's really fast paced, which is always good. But yeah, it was a nice mixture of the thrasher horror and a lot of light moments. I think it will be pretty, pretty sweet!

You play Nick. What's he's like?

Milligan: Well, Nick is a sort of shy, reclusive type. I hesitate to use the word "nerdy" but for simplicity's sake it's the easiest term to use. He's a pre-med student and follows a group of his friends to go to this lake house and as the events unfold as they do, he comes out of his shell and reluctantly accepts his role as hero of the night.

What was it like filming in the water? Was that challenging?

Milligan: My gosh! For the first whole week there was a lot of me underwater alone and I remember on my first day I had to breathe underwater in this large swimming pool-size tank with scuba rigs. The director would call action and we'd be eight feet deep and they'd remove the rig, I'd swim and do our little scene and just off camera, we would go grab another rig to keep breathing. They gave us training, but my very first time I choked and I got scared because I couldn't breathe properly. Everyone was looking at each other like, "Is this kid going to do it or what?" Then I thought, "Okay Dustin, time to buck up," and it was pretty smooth sailing after that. But I never thought I would ever do action movies and I absolutely loved it.

What was it like working with mechanical sharks? Milligan: I can't tell you how scary these things were. The effects team that put these sharks together made them hyper-realistic; they used real shark teeth in their mouths. There were some instances where we had to physically fight with the shark and it was like a mechanical bull underwater. You can't help but have a bit of a *Terminator* moment where you think this is where the rise of the machine begins and I'm about to be the first victim of the mechanical machine shark!

What was it like working with Sara Paxton and the cast? Did you bond onset?

Milligan: You know, there's always potential for drama and for ego to tarnish a group shoot like this, but we all just sort of threw our "L.A.-ness" out the window. There's a lot of group training that we had to do that allowed us to very quickly bond. We all had a lot of fun and a lot of us still keep in touch constantly to this day.
