

Hollywood's Leading Ladies

Leading ladies of Hollywood are unstoppable on the big screen. Tribute takes a look into the careers of some of Tinsletown's glamorous stars.



achel McAdams' meteoric rise to fame has never been short on box office success or critical acclaim, propelling the Canadian native to become one of the most in-demand names in Hollywood.

Born in London, Ontario, McAdams began her acting career at the age of 12, starring in summer camp plays and local productions before studying drama in University. After a few small TV roles, McAdams big break came in 2004, in the teencomedy Mean Girls. That same year McAdams' became a household name starring opposite fellow London-native Ryan Gosling in the romantic smash *The Notebook*.

Following that, McAdams took on a variety of diverse roles, playing everything from a bride-to-be in The Wedding Crashers (2005), to a cutthroat journalist in State of Play (2009) and a con-woman heroine in Sherlock Holmes (2009).

McAdams will continue to mix things up this season as a TV producer forced to recruit a crusty news anchor (Harrison Ford) to a morning show, while juggling a blossoming romance (Patrick Wilson) in the romantic-comedy Morning Glory. McAdams told Ain't it Cool News that Morning Glory's modern TV news setting was a "world that has changed so much and it's really high gloss now, so it's fun to interpret it." Look for next year to be even busier for McAdams, when she takes on the Woody Allen comedy Midnight in Paris, and a rumored reprising role in the upcoming Sherlock Holmes' sequel.

ven though her acting career began at the age of 13, Natalie Portman has managed to avoid becoming a child-star casualty. In fact, she's the exact opposite: a strict vegan, socially responsible, Harvard-educated actress, writer and director.

Her big break came with the role of Mathilda in the acclaimed Luc Besson film The Professional, and she became a household name after starring as Queen Amidala in the Star Wars movies. Taking increasingly challenging roles in films like V for Vendetta and The Other Boleyn Girl, and making her directorial debut

with New York, I Love you, Natalie continues to prove her talent as the years pass. In the upcoming Black Swan, from acclaimed director Darren Aronofsky (Requiem for a Dream, The Wrestler), she plays the slowly unraveling ballet dancer, Nina.

The stunning beauty recently made headlines as she signed a deal with the French fashion house, Dior, to front their new fragrance campaign—the first time Portman has ever done so. Claude Martinez, president and chief executive officer of Parfums Christian Dior, said: "We are extremely excited to have Miss Portman embody our house. She will symbolize with grace the values of luxury and the glamour of Dior."

But her primary focus is on her movie career. "You're trying to do your best with everything, with your whole soul as much as you can, and sometimes people completely ignore it and you have to be fine with that," she told Vanity Fair. If the Oscar buzz surrounding her performance in Black Swan is any indication, no one is ignoring what could be the pivotal role of her career.

The It Girl Anne HATHAWA

ith her creamy skin and thousand-kilowatt smile, 28-year-old Anne Hathaway is a quintessential Hollywood starlet. She first turned heads when she played royalty in The Princess Diaries. The fairy tale continued when she achieved further fame through her role in The Devil Wears Prada, and then showed the world she could be taken seriously with a turn in the edgy Rachel Getting Married, for which she was nominated for a best actress Oscar.



In her most recent film, Love & Other Drugs, she plays opposite dreamy Jake Gyllenhaal as a free spirit named Maggie who doesn't want to be tied down until she finds her perfect match in Jamie in the most unlikely of places. Maggie and Jamie's evolving relationship takes them both by surprise, as

they find themselves under the influence of the ultimate drug: love.

In real life, Hathaway, a spokesmodel for Marc Jacobs and Lancôme, hasn't had the easiest path towards finding Prince Charming. In 2008, her longtime Italian real estate developer boyfriend Raffaello Follieri was arrested for fraud and Hathaway was left heartbroken, and recently her actor boyfriend Adam Shulman was arrested for theft of a painting. But she doesn't seem to let her romantic trials get her down, saying her mantra is an Oscar Wilde quote, which also helps her guard her personal life: "The less said about life's sores, the better." And how could she possibly be blue when her career is flourishing? "At the end of the day, whatever goes wrong I can't even focus on it, because it always comes back to 'I'm the luckiest girl on planet Earth,'" she recently said.

rom rags to riches, Leighton Meester has risen up through the Hollywood ranks thanks to a starring role on *Gossip Girl* as Blair Waldorf—a stint that's helped the young star move from the small screen to the big screen.

Moving from Florida to New York at age 11 to pursue acting, Meester got an

early crack at stardom when she began modeling and finding small roles on shows like Law & Order, Boston Public and Entourage.

In recent years, Meester has ascended to the big-screen through a versatile set of roles—from teen dramas (*Remember The Daze*, 2007), to horrors (*Killer Movie*, 2008) to comedies (*Date Night*, 2010). Along with her successful jump to film, Meester has become a surprise singing sensation, with an upcoming album scheduled for next year, and has snagged a beauty contract with Herbal Essences shampoo. "I think embracing your natural beauty is the best thing. I take really good care of my hair and that starts in the shower. I really like Herbal Essences Dazzle and Shine and Beautiful Ends—both of those lines are good for keeping my hair healthy, strong and shiny," Meester recently said.

Next up for Meester is *Country Strong* with Gywneth Paltow (for which she also showcases her singing abilities), and in next year's *The Roommate* and *Monte Carlo*. In *The Roommate*, she plays Rebecca, an unstable college student dangerously obsessed with her roommate (Alyson Michalka). She also stars alongside Selena Gomez and Katie Cassidy in the Valentine's Day release *Monte Carlo*, a romantic comedy set in France. *Monte Carlo* follows a trio of girls on a Paris vacation that is turned upside down when one of them is mistaken for a rich heiress, leading the ladies into a dream world of paparazzi, private jets and couture gowns—not far off from Meester's own real life.

In Monsters, first-time director Gareth Edwards takes a stab at the monster movie genre, and kicks things up a notch by filming it guerilla style, and on a low budget.

The story is set six years after a NASA probe—carrying samples of possible alien life—crashes over Central America. But when new life begins to form, half of Mexico becomes quarantined and deemed as the "Infected Zone." When US journalist (Scoot McNairy) agrees to escort a shaken tourist (Whitney Able) through the infected zone in order to get

Tribute's Toni-Marie Ippolito spoke to writer/director Edwards, and actors McNairy and Able (who are married in real life), about what it was like filming without a script, the alien creatures and the challenges of filming in Mexico.

home, they do all they can to survive to get to the US Border.

What's so cool about this movie is that you shot in on the fly. Was this always your intention?

Edwards: Part of the reason for doing it was to try and do it very guerilla, and very low budget, and prove that you don't need that much money to make something look like it got a lot of money involved. It was always my goal to finance my own film and shoot something with a domestic camera, and stick in visual effects. I thought it would take about a year to get in and edit that, and it took about a decade!

As actors, were you guys worried about this filming style?

Able: I was excited about this adventure. The guerilla style of filmmaking was exciting and then I got really nervous when we got down there and realized there was a total loss of control, which is scary for an actor.

McNairy: The idea of going down to Mexico and just shooting a film on the fly...my thoughts were, 'Hmmm... filming in Mexico, travelling around, near-death experiences... I'm in!'

You also didn't have a script in place. Was that a challenge?

Edwards: We had a scene by scene outline, so basically we had a file of facts, because we were in the middle of the jungle, so

laptops don't actually last that long, so we had these blue and black pages. The black pages were physical things that happened to the characters and the blue were emotional things we learn about them. We would drive along in a van, and we would see something really cool in the middle of Central America, and we would drive out and we would go, "OK what scene can we do here?" and I would shoot it a bit like a documentary.

The cast would do whatever it wanted, and I would dare them sometimes. I wouldn't say "action" or "cut." I would start rolling. I feel the performances we got from everybody was natural. It just felt like it was really happening and it was a real place.

McNairy: Shooting without a script is very demanding on the actor. You can't rehearse, because there's nothing to rehearse! The only thing we could do was work on our character's backstories, and just keep layering it as we went along.

Did you guys get to see a sketch of what the monsters would look like?

McNairy: Once we did see them, it was how Gareth had explained them—being bioluminescent. He sent us the James Cameron documentary *Aliens of the Deep* and he said, "I want them to look like this." When we saw them, we thought, "Wow, he really nailed it on the head. The creatures look amazing."

Would you say there is a twist in this movie?


Able: Well, I wouldn't say it's a "twist." I think the key thing is for people to keep their eyes open from the start of the movie until the end.

Here we are, fast approaching a new year. And looking back, 2010 was a great year in music...but there are still a few HOT albums to drop before we hit 2011.




In the upcoming My Week With Marilyn, one of Hollywood's newest blonde bombshells is tackling the role of this Hollywood legend: Michelle Williams.




