

Daniel Craig solidifies his 007 status


N *Quantum of Solace*, Bond goes on an explosive mission to seek out the underground organization that blackmailed Vesper. As he gets closer to finding the man responsible, Bond must keep one step ahead of the CIA, the terrorists and even M, to unravel a sinister plan. *Tribute*'s Bonnie Laufer-Krebs and Toni-Marie Ippolito talked to Daniel Craig, Olga Kurylenko and director Marc Forster about what it was like to bring 007 back to the big screen.

Laufer-Krebs: Do you still feel pressure to play Bond?

Craig: Yeah, and I think there should be pressure there because there's a lot of money being spent and you've kind of got to get it right. But with the success of *Casino Royale* we had somewhere to go and had something behind us that was successful so that we could match it or better it.

Laufer-Krebs: This is a more dramatic Bond. Was that important for you to bring this time?

Craig: In making a sequel we all agreed that we needed to tie up loose ends and that sort of journey needed to be finished, and I think we've done it incredibly successfully.



Laufer-Krebs: Olga's Bond girl really gave you a run for your life! Craig: Yes, she was great. Her story ties in with Bond in that she's on this revenge mission and it was important that she was strong and that they could have respect for one another. They don't consummate their relationship in this because that's not the deal. Olga carries this mystery and strength about her that was important for the role.

Ippolito: Camille is a different kind of Bond girl. How would you describe her?

Kurylenko: She is an independent and strong woman. She has her own mission, and her motivation is revenge. She exists as a separate character from Bond because she has her own story and she is very interesting and different from other Bond girls because she doesn't need Bond to exist even though he crosses her path.

Ippolito: What was it like working with Daniel? Did he motivate you? Kurylenko: He's such an amazing actor. He trained so much and constantly worked on his character to make it better and better. He tried to do all these stunts by himself and that's what motivated me to do the same thing. Some of the scenes were really hard but he told me when you watch the movie you're going to be so happy you did it. I watched it and it was incredible to see

Ippolito: Why do you think Daniel makes an excellent Bond?

what I did.

Kurylenko: His Bond is really believable. We can believe that he can really fight and kick ass because he has a strong body. The other Bonds were a little more delicate and he's just a tough cookie.



Ippolito: This movie is so actionpacked! Do the expectations get higher for every Bond film, especially for you directing a sequel?

Forster: I had a huge amount of pressure on this one! After *Casino Royale*, which was the most successful Bond film ever, the expectations were pretty high. I was thinking, "Oh my God, there were 21 Bond films before this and they were all successful," and I thought, "What am I going to do if I fail?" Even now, when it's finished I think, "Is it going to go the way you hope it will?"

Ippolito: Every scene in this film is done on a grand scale.

Forster: That was the approach for me, in that if I'm making a Bond film it has to be on a grand scale and that the locations are sort of characters themselves. I thought in all the Bond films you identify with all these iconic locations, that it was really important to show some of them and capture them.

Ippolito: Why do you think Daniel works so well as James Bond?

Forster: Obviously he has this incredible sex appeal and an interesting look, but he also humanized Bond. He brought Bond into a completely human being, a three-dimensional character that we can all relate to.





ATTERS of the heart are never easy, but for Bella Swan, it's downright lethal. Her love story isn't your average one. Sure, Edward Cullen is perfect in every sense. He's charming, incredibly intelligent and so handsome that no girl is able to resist touching his beautiful porcelain-like skin. There's only one problem: Edward is not human. He's a vampire.

Based on the bestselling novels by Stephenie Meyer (there are four books in the series, including New Moon, Eclipse and Breaking Dawn), Twilight follows the life of an average 17-year-old teenage girl who moves from sunny Arizona to live with her father in the gloomy, rainy town of Forks, Washington. Bella not only has the burden of meeting new friends at her high school, she also unknowingly falls in love with a vampire. And fans of the series, of all ages, can't seem to get enough. In fact, the anticipation for the big-screen version directed by Catherine Hardwicke (Thirteen)—is fierce.

The appeal for actress Kristen Stewart (*Into the Wild*) to play Bella was not just in the hype, but in who the character was. "I could relate to her because she's just a very straight-up, good-natured girl who found herself in an insane position," Stewart told Premiere.com. "[She's] seemingly logical, and then all of a sudden [is] just swept away by something more powerful than her. Every girl wants to lose herself, and Bella started out hard and just lost it, and that's what I really loved about it."

In the beginning, Bella seems to think Edward (Robert Pattinson, *Harry Potter*) dislikes her. Certainly he and his siblings, Alice (played by Ashley Greene), Emmett (Kellan Lutz), Rosalie (Nikki Reed) and Jasper (Jackson Rathbone), keep their distance from everyone. But the Cullens are not your average vampires. Following a strict code imposed by the head of their family, Carlisle (Peter Facinelli), who is also a doctor at the local hospital, and mother Esme (Elizabeth Reaser), do not kill humans but rather feed on

animals for their blood—unlike the baddies James (Cam Gigandet) and Victoria (played by Canadian actress Rachelle Lefevre) who come to town to shake up the town's human blood supply. As Bella enters their circle, it's hard for them not to be tempted by her sweet blood, especially for Edward when in intimate situations with Bella.

"The more Bella says, 'I'm not scared of you,' the more I believe it myself and I kind of forget that I am a vampire and what my actual urges are," Pattinson told movies.about.com. "I try and kiss her and obviously it ends up being a nightmare. She has a hormonal rush and I have a kind of like, I want to kill you rush. It ends up being quite sexy, though, in a weird sort of way. But I don't know. It's kind of like you're at a point where you want to do everything and kill at the same time."

For loyal book fans, Meyer assures the movie and the cast will live up to the hype. "The goal was to make it as close to the book as possible, given the time constraints of the film," Meyer said. "I also think Kristen is a really great actress. When they got her in hair and makeup, Kristen really got it down. Plus, I really love her voice. I just think she has Bella's voice."

With the loss of Paul Newman a few weeks ago, Clint Eastwood just may be one of the last actor/directors left to carry the torch for classic Hollywood stars with still-viable careers. Not only is Eastwood not slowing down at the age of 78, he seems to be speeding up.

Coming straight from directing the true-life tragedy film *Changeling* (with Angelina Jolie), Eastwood directs and stars in *Gran Torino*, in which he plays a Korean War vet who confronts his own intolerance. "I'm a weirdo in it. I play a real racist," Eastwood recently told *USA Today*. "[He] looks down on Asian people and lumps everybody together. But finally they befriend him in his time of need because he has no relationship with his family."

Eastwood's successful filmmaking career has seen its share of Oscar buzz, and *Gran Torino* is no exception. But Eastwood remains modest and merely shrugs off the hype, pointing out with typical directness, "Nobody has seen it (yet)." Good point. But in Eastwood's capable hands, any film is a potential Oscar winner.

OW would your life be different if you said "yes" when you would usually say "no?" Jim Carrey's character Carl Allen is a man who resolves to do just that in his new comedy *Yes Man*.

Based on the true experiences of British comedian Danny Wallace, *Yes Man* shows how Carl's life becomes a lot more interesting when he accepts every invitation, proposal and suggestion that he encounters. He also ends up getting into a boatload of mischief. At one point, Carl has his first memorable encounter with the energy drink Red Bull (actually, he drinks so much of it that if they had a breathalyzer test for caffeine, he would have blown well over the legal limit). In true Carrey fashion,

he acts like a complete nut for much of the film, but still manages to reveal the heart of his character. It's a return to form for the 46-year-old Canadian comedian, with echoes of the massive 1997 hit, *Liar Liar*.

Since his breakout with *Ace Ventura: Pet Detective* 14 years ago, Carrey has seen phenomenal success and huge paydays. But as he told *60 Minutes* several months ago, his unique comic craziness comes from a much darker place. "Desperation," Carrey said. "I had a sick mom, man. I wanted to make her feel better... I used to go in [her bedroom] and do impressions of praying mantises, and weird things, and whatever. I'd bounce off the walls and throw myself down the stairs to make her feel better."

In that interview, Carrey also admitted to battling depression. Yet these days, he seems to be in a much better place. In interviews, he comes across as a man at peace with himself, and his relationship with actress Jenny McCarthy has had a profound impact on him. His affection for McCarthy is obvious and his dedication to standing with her in her crusade on autism issues seems to have given him strength. (McCarthy's six-year-old son, Evan, is autistic.)

Co-starring in *Yes Man* is Zooey Deschanel (*Elf*), Bradley Cooper (*Wedding Crashers*), Terrence Stamp (*Get Smart*) and Danny Masterson (*That '70s Show*).



The Spirit

Gabriel Macht, Scarlett Johansson, Eva Mendes and Samuel L. Jackson dive into the fantasy world of one of comics' most legendary graphic novels.

F you're suffering from movie comic withdrawal, you can put an end to your symptoms as Will Eisner's *The Spirit* swooshes onto the big screen this holiday season. And who better to make it all the more dark and exciting than director Frank Miller (Sin City, 300)?

The story follows a former rookie cop, Denny Colt, who returns mysteriously



from the dead as The Spirit (Gabriel Macht), to fight crime from the shadows of Central City. "Denny was an orphan who grew up on the streets. He had a desire to be a cop when he was a kid. So, when he grew up, he was passionate about fulfilling his dream," Macht said of his character at Comic-Con. "Once he's the Spirit, he's a man trying to figure himself out. He knows he loves the ladies,

equal to loving truth, justice and the American way."

His archenemy, The Octopus (Jackson), has a different mission. With an evil genius-type plan, Octopus plans to wipe out Spirit's beloved city as he pursues his own version of immortality. "It's sort of Wile E. Coyote with real people," Jackson told MTV. "We hit each other with big things [and] we're both kind of indestructible, so it's funny in that way. We get shot up, we get stabbed up, and we just don't die."

As Macht's Spirit tracks the coldhearted killer Octopus from Central City's rundown warehouses to the damp catacombs to the windswept waterfront, he's also forced to deal with a few beautiful women who either want to seduce, love or kill our masked crusader. What's an action hero to do? "All of the actresses have been great," Macht says. "Scarlett, Eva, they're just amazing...so tough and sexy."


Of course these sexy women have their own agenda, making things more complicated for the Spirit. Eva Mendes plays Sand Saref, the jewel thief with dangerous curves. "I've never actually played, like, a real femme fatale," admitted Mendes during Comic-Con. "And this woman is just, you know, she is just...she

would eat you for breakfast!" This will also be the first time Mendes shows a little back skin in a film. "I'm excited to see what happens with this scene. Well, I don't think it's 'excited.' I'm actually nervous," Mendes told The Daily Record. "I think they have a butt shot of me. I'm not sure how it ended up."

Playing the other femme fatale is Scarlett Johansson, who is Silken Floss, a frigid, punk secretary to the Octopus. "I loved playing such a big character," Johansson has said. "The dialogue is so black and white. As an actor it's nice to play all of these different things. If I was just doing these movies greenscreen or these independent movies, there'd just be no purpose to it." Adds Deborah Del Prete, the film's producer, "When Frank met with Scarlett he said, 'I know what I want to do with this role. I have an idea for Silken Floss; I want to take her and make her a bigger character and Scarlett Johansson is the person who can do that.' So Floss was pretty much custom to her and I think people will find this is a different side of Scarlett. She is very funny, very sexy and very different than we've seen her in other movies."

Separation and divorce are very common—almost half of all marriages break up. But even if you know lots of people whose parents are divorced it's still upsetting if it happens to your family.

Divorce and your feelings

Divorce causes so many changes in a family. Some of these changes can make you feel really sad. Here are some of the things you may feel sad about:

- you may miss the times your family had together or the times your family won't have in the future (e.g. you probably won't have family holidays or celebrations together)
- you may miss seeing both of your parents every day
- you may miss your friends, neighbourhood, house or school if you have to move.

Divorce can make you really angry. Here are just some of the reasons you may feel mad:

- you may be mad at your parents for breaking up your family
- you may be mad at your parents for not trying hard enough to save their marriage
- you may be mad about having to choose which parent you live with

You might find that you are angrier with one parent than the other if you feel that parent is more to blame for the divorce. It's normal to feel angry and resentful. After all, you probably didn't ask for any of the big changes that will happen in your life as a result of the divorce.

Divorce can make you feel worried for a lot of reasons. Here are just some of the things you may worry about:

- how much your life is going to change
- how you will choose which parent to live with
- how you will cope with moving, starting a new school or making new friends
- if your family will have enough money
- that other people in your family (e.g. a brother or sister or your parents) are really upset

What you can do

A lot of kids feel guilty because they think that they are to blame for their parents' divorce. You may find yourself thinking things like: "If only I didn't argue with them they would still be together!" Kids don't cause their parents to divorce. Parents divorce because of problems with their relationship.

You may feel relieved if your parents are divorcing, especially if they fought all the time. Your parents may actually feel happier and get along better if they are living apart. You probably just realize that sometimes a divorce can make everyone's lives more peaceful.

Things you can do:

It's hard on your whole family if your parents break up. Your parents will probably make most of the big decisions about how your lives are going to change, but they may want your input. Try to speak with them about your worries and about how you can work together to make things as easy as possible. You may also want to:

- write (a journal, poetry, letters to your parents)
- do something artistic (paint, draw, sculpt)
- sing, dance, make music
- get active (play basketball, swim, run, bike—anything)
- talk to other kids whose parents have divorced
- talk to someone you trust (a teacher, school counselor or another family member)

If your parents share custody you may enjoy setting up a room for yourself in each of your parents' homes. Many families develop new rituals around holidays that can be fun and different from what you are used to. You may even get to celebrate special occasions twice! Of course this doesn't take away the sadness of divorce but it does make it easier to cope with.





Do you think it's hard for you to meet somebody who can see you for what you are, as opposed to what the image is?

HILTON: Yeah. Every time I meet someone, they're so surprised. If someone doesn't know me, they'll meet me and just be like, "Oh my God, you're so different than I thought you'd be. And you're so down to earth and sweet and real." And people, when they know me, just realize that I'm a really good person.

How hard is it to balance a music career with an acting career?

HILTON: It's so much fun for me. I'm doing what I love to do. I live every day as if it's my last, and just live life to the fullest. And with my brand, I can basically do whatever I want. And I always try to, no matter where I go, incorporate everything together, so if I have to promote a movie or my line or something, it's just all incorporated together. I can do it all at once.

What is your ultimate ambition? If you had one thing that you could do that would be the be-all and end-all, professionally or personally, what would it be?

HILTON: Just sort of continue doing my work, and expanding my empire, and eventually opening my own hotel

chains, casinos and nightclubs. And then being a great mom, and having beautiful children.

How challenging has it been for you, for producers to see you as something other than the blonde or the icon that we associate you with? **HILTON:** I think every day I do new things that surprise people and just continue expanding my brand. I've been in this business for over ten years now and I think every day people see a new side to me and that I'm a lot smarter than most people think.

What would you like to say to set the record straight about what people think of you?

HILTON: I just think there are a lot of misconceptions. A lot of people think I don't work and I just get money from my family and that I don't do anything. But, really, I'm running a huge empire. I have my album coming out. I have my own clothing line, shoes, make-up, lingerie, purses and hair extensions. Oscar-nominated actor Joaquin Phoenix says bon voyage to Hollywood

E was always known for being an eccentric type, and often shied away from press events and the paparazzi. But Oscarnominated actor Joaquin Phoenix made up for it with his gripping and talented performances in the movies—from *Gladiator* to *Walk The Line* to *Reservation Road*.

But despite comments from the entertainment world that pegged Phoenix as one of Hollywood's greatest actors of his generation, Phoenix stunned the movie world with this statement: "I want to take this opportunity...and just talk a little bit about the fact that this will be my last performance as an actor. I'm not doing films anymore."

It's rediscovering something else," said Phoenix in an interview with Associated Press. "It's like greener pastures, you know what I mean?" Phoenix continued. "And so, I'm just going to try and
