Angelina JOLIE



Otherhood is a role Angelina Jolie knows all too well. Just three months after giving birth to twins Knox Leon and Vivienne Marcheline, the mother of six will appear on the big screen in *Changeling*, playing a single mother to a nine-year-old boy. While in real life, Jolie shares parenting duties with Brad Pitt, it wasn't always the way. After her 2002 split from Billy Bob Thornton, Jolie assumed sole custody of their son Maddox. Until that point, she says she didn't have much of a maternal instinct. "I never had children around me growing up," she recently said. "I didn't even know how to hold a child. I had a child in a film and I was terrified of it!" Now, six years later, she's a natural. She says, "I love being a mom. That is where I belong and what really feels right for me."

Still, playing a mother on the big screen isn't what one of the world's most beautiful actresses is best known for. From videogame adventurer (the Lara Croft series) to married hired gun (in



Mr. & Mrs. Smith) to assassin in the recently released *Wanted*, Jolie is a favorite in dangerous, sexy roles. With 40 films on her resume, she has played a wide range of roles that have so far garnered her four Golden Globes, two SAGs, an Oscar and dozens of nominations, including two Emmy nods.

Now, in this period piece (it's set in the Roaring Twenties), Jolie plays Christine Collins, a single working mother whose prayers are answered when her kidnapped son is returned to her. But amidst the chaos of the media-crazed reunion, she realizes the son is not hers. The scenario would be a nightmare for any mother, but knowing the movie is based on true events made it even more difficult to play. Jolie recently said that the difference when making a film based on a true story is that typically, "The pressure is wondering what the audience is going to take out of it. It's very different when you feel the story represents a family you want to honor."

Still, it wouldn't have been Jolie's first stab at a story based on

true events. In 1998, she played the lead role in the HBO film *Gia*, which chronicled the life of heroin-addicted model Gia Carangi, who at the age of 26 became one of the first celebrities to die of AIDS. The next year, Jolie stole the spotlight and garnered an Oscar for her supporting role as the sociopathic runaway patient in *Girl*, *Interrupted*.

But initially, Jolie was reluctant to take on the role of a mother of a kidnapped child. She'd just completed filming on *A Mighty Heart*, in which she gave a heartrending portrayal of Mariane Pearl, whose husband, journalist Daniel Pearl, was kidnapped and executed while Mariane was pregnant with their first child. In real life, the role hit close to home for Jolie, who was pregnant with Shiloh at the time. While Christine Collins is a woman that Jolie said she "came to admire," as an actor, there was a lot about the story that made her uncomfortable. "I didn't want to do a film about a child being kidnapped, because I think there's something to bringing certain things into your environment, in your thoughts and in your world. But ultimately, it was her strength when faced with such odds that swayed me. I'm most fond of this story because of how it exposes corruption of those in power. It's very timely; we still deal with that today."

The film, produced by Ron Howard and Brian Grazer, quickly attracted Clint Eastwood on board as director, who read the script



on a plane to Berlin and immediately liked it. When the producers told Eastwood that Jolie had agreed, he was pleased. "I like her work a lot," said Eastwood, who also directed her in *The Good Shepherd*. Everyone involved agreed that the unbelievable events would make a captivating film, especially with Jolie on board, who made it her life's mission to find her boy. "Angelina is unique," said Eastwood. "She reminds me a lot of the actresses from the Golden Age of movies in the 1940s: Katharine Hepburn, Bette Davis, Ingrid Bergman, Susan Hayward. They were all very distinctive, and they all had a lot of presence. She's a tremendous actress."

hange, for some, can be a scary word. But for the ever-transforming Rachel McAdams, it's an everyday necessity. "It's a compulsion. I'm always changing parts of me. Even when I was young, I wanted to change my hair color...Even my handwriting changes regularly," she told the *New York Times*. This need for change makes McAdams' diverse choice in roles no surprise. She's gone from playing a blonde hot chick to an even blonder mean girl to a brunette wedding crasher. However, this Canadian sweetheart is so much more than her evolving hair color.

Growing up in rural Ontario, McAdams had grand inspirations of acting in movies. "It would have been too big of a dream to say you want to go to Hollywood. But, secretly, I think I always knew," she explained. After starring in the small Canadian film *Perfect Pie*, McAdams got her first taste of Hollywood in 2002's *The Hot Chick*, which quickly led to her breakout role as Regina George in *Mean Girls*. Playing the teen queen bee opposite Lindsay Lohan put McAdams on the map, but it was her next role as lovable Allie Hamilton in the oh-so-romantic *The Notebook* that catapulted this small-town beauty to super-stardom.

Following the success of *The Notebook*, and her high-profile relationship with co-star Ryan Gosling, McAdams soon found herself being handed scripts. Instead of auditioning for roles, she was now being offered sought-after parts in a long list of star-studded films including *Wedding Crashers*, *Red Eye* and *The Family Stone*.

A true Canadian, McAdams was intent on not letting the success of Hollywood get to her and took a brief hiatus to put everything in perspective. "I don't like to work all the time. When I'm working, the rest of my life slips away," she told the *New York Times*. "I

press pause on everything, and then, when I'm done working, I get back to the world I'm trying to interpret in the movies."

Luckily for us, McAdams has paused her life once again for her next film, *The Lucky Ones*, co-starring Tim Robbins. The film

centers around three soldiers who return home from fighting in Iraq, only to find that "home" isn't quite what they remembered. "When I first read the script, I didn't get my character and I found that interesting. She had such a mishmash of qualities—one minute she's a hellcat and the next she's so sensitive. I liked that sense of complication," she explained.

Seems like the perfect role for the "always changing" McAdams.

Nicole KIDMAN

Ticole is a thoroughbred," says director Baz Luhrmann to Vogue. Luhrmann would know. He's directed Kidman in numerous films including Moulin Rouge, and has become one of her dearest friends. "She is highly strung, highly volatile, highly everything." Those qualities were apparently needed to play the



role of the aristocratic Lady Sarah in his upcoming epic film Australia, also starring another Aussie native, Hugh Iackman.

Although she was born in Honolulu, Hawaii, Kidman's parents moved their family to Sydney when she was very young. By the time the statuesque, wildly curly red-haired star hit her teens she was ready for stardom.

After a few stints on Australian television, Kidman's breakthrough in Hollywood was with Days of Thunder, in which she also snagged, and married, one of Hollywood's most eligible bachelors, Tom Cruise. But she was determined to make her mark on her own merits—which soon followed in the form of a fame-crazed housewife determined to eliminate any obstacle in her path in Gus Van Sant's To Die For (1995). She later solidified her status as one of Hollywood's most in-demand actresses when she won the Best Actress Oscar for her portrayal of Virginia Woolf in The Hours.

As Kidman's career has evolved, so has her personal life. Already a mother to her adopted children Isabella and Connor, whom she shares with ex-husband Cruise, she recently gave birth to daughter Sunday Rose with her country music star husband Keith Urban, who also happens to be a fellow Australian.



It's only befitting that this Hollywood icon would return to her roots in an epic way with Australia. Set in northern Australia prior to World War II, the film tells the story of an English aristocrat (Kidman) who inherits a ranch the size of Maryland. When English

> cattle barons plot to take her land, she joins forces with a cattle driver (Jackman) to drive 2000 head of cattle across hundreds of miles of the country's most unforgiving land, only to still face the bombing of Darwin, Australia by the Japanese forces that had attacked

> > Pearl Harbor only months earlier.

"It's the roughest thing I ever had to go through," Kidman says about filming. "The heat was debilitating. I was sitting on a horse once and I remember thinking, Gosh, this is what it feels like before you faint-and then I fainted." Although Kidman found out she was pregnant during shooting, that didn't stop her from roughing it out in the wilderness. "There was another time we flew in by helicopter to the Salt Flats-it was like a moonscape, there was just nothing there—and we got caught in a dust storm so bad we couldn't even see. Everybody lived out there for five days in these little silver tents. It was great. That's the adventure. That's why you make movies. It's the equivalent of The African Queen, where they were out in the wilderness and Katharine Hepburn was washing her hair with a bucket. We all want that experience."

Scarlett JOHANSSON

ew would have guessed, when Scarlett Johansson played the young Grace MacLean in 1998's *The Horse Whisperer*, that she would later take Hollywood by storm and become a prized face in the movie industry. Though Johansson had been in six films before *The Horse Whisperer*, it was her role as a young girl in that picture (she was 13 at the time), opposite and directed by Robert Redford, that garnered her industry recognition and credibility as well as a Young Star Award.

But it wasn't until Johansson appeared in *Lost in Translation* that moviegoers and Hollywood realized her star power. In 2003 she starred in *Girl With a Pearl Earring*, and quickly became Woody Allen's muse after starring in three of his films: *Match Point*, *Scoop* and *Vicky Cristina Barcelona*.





The New York native has played more than actress with her fame and her face. After a two-year contract representing Calvin Klein fragrances, making a reported \$1 million per year, Johansson signed on with L'Oréal as a spokesmodel in January of 2006. It is said that her four-year contract with the cosmetics giant will put \$3 million in her pocket every year. But it hasn't been all roses for Johansson's career. The sometimes singer (she sang a version of The Pretenders' "Brass in Pocket" on the *Lost in Translation* soundtrack) released her debut album earlier this year to the disappointment of both critics and fans. Her album, *Anywhere I Lay My Head*, reached its highest position on The Billboard 200 chart at #126 in June, 2008, a mere two weeks after its release.

Fortunately, all is not lost in Johansson's translation of life. She announced her engagement earlier this year to Canadian beefcake Ryan Reynolds, and is continuing what she does best: acting. Johansson's latest film, *The Spirit*, opens the actress to a new genre. Based on the comic strip following a crime fighter known as The Spirit (who fights bad guys in a business suit, red tie and fedora—what else?), the flick, which also stars Samuel L. Jackson and Eva Mendes, is most anticipated for its graphics and special effects.


The director is famed comic writer and director Frank Miller, whose 300 and Sin City films fast became visual legends. Johansson says she's excited to be on the project. "Working with Frank Miller was so exciting for me! He's so wonderful," Johansson told film.com. "He's such a visionary. Literally, he'll lead you through the story-board he's drawn out and everybody gets excited about the next shot. Then, working with Sam Jackson, whom I love and always admired. He's so great to work with. I mean, what a co-star! I loved playing such a big character. The dialogue is so black and white. As an actor, it's nice to play all of these different things."


finally broke onto the A-list scene.

Soon after the release of

Seabiscuit, Banks found herself in demand for the first time in her career. The up-and-coming "It" girl reprised her role as Miss Brant in the Spider-Man sequels and landed parts in a string of blockbuster hits, including The 40 Year-Old Virgin, Invincible and Slither. But, for TV fans, she's best known as Dr. Kim Briggs on the NBC sitcom Scrubs.

Even amidst the controversy one thing's for sure: when it comes to impressing viewers, she doesn't need to worry. Banks does admit that she hopes the First Lady will see the film. "I hope she sneaks a peek," Banks says. "I hope I got her essence right."

Paul Newman

January 26, 1925 – September 26, 2008

E was the epitome of the Hollywood Golden Era. His intense blue eyes, his great characters and, of course, his good looks, not only made the ladies swoon, but also made him a screen star. "Paul Newman played many unforgettable roles. But the ones for which he was proudest never had top billing on the marquee," his daughters said in a statement following their father's death from cancer.

But aside from his work in Hollywood, the Oscar-winning actor was best known for his business, Newman's Own, which since 1982 has made popcorn, tomato sauce, lemonade and salad dressing and has donated more than \$250 million to charities selected by Newman himself.

Newman leaves behind five adult children: Stephanie and Susan with his first wife, Jacqueline Witte, and Clea, Nell, and Lissy with his wife of 50 years, Joanne Woodward. (A son, Scott, died of an accidental drug overdose in 1978.) "Our father was a rare symbol of selfless humility, the last to acknowledge what he was doing was special. Intensely private, he quietly succeeded beyond measure in impact-

ing the lives of so many with his generosity," his family said in a statement. "He will be profoundly missed by those whose lives he touched, but he leaves us with extraordinary inspiration to draw upon."


