THE AMAZING SPIDER-MAN



It's the summer of comic book heroes—as the Dark Knight completes his run, a new Spider-Man takes flight.

In an age when critics are looking at Hollywood pictures even more cynically and the originality of major movie studios is being brought into question as remakes, reboots and 3D re-releases become the norm, *The Amazing Spider-Man* has become a mascot for the current age of film—a reboot of a franchise that concluded just five years ago.

"We all have secrets," Andrew Garfield's Peter Parker says.

"The ones we keep and the ones that are kept from us."

However, instead of being met with the virtual eye-rolls and Internet backlash that is induced any time a remake is announced, *The Amazing Spider-Man* has somehow managed to increase its built-in audience, creating excitement and an electric buzz that has comic and movie fans alike counting down the days until its release.

The story is well known. While on a quest to uncover the truth about his parents' disappearance, Parker is bitten by a radioactive spider, causing him to gain superhuman abilities. Things become even trickier when the police chief father of his love interest, Gwen Stacy, makes it his mission to track down the masked crime fighter.

"With great power comes great responsibility," are the iconic words uttered by Parker's Uncle Ben, that seem to perfectly encapsulate director Marc Webb, who no doubt feels his responsibility in crafting a film that's gratifying and faithful to Spidey's origins without




drawing too many comparisons to the earlier trilogy. However, it's not the franchise's similarities that have people talking, it's the differences.

When the teaser trailer premiered last summer, it was smarter, sleeker and more grounded in reality, and was instantly met with overwhelming support from even the most skeptical die-hards. They embraced the installment as a new beginning for the stalling series, appreciating the back-to-basics approach that honored the source material in a way its predecessor failed.

Think of it as *Smallville* for Spider-Man. Instead of a film that emphasizes the *man* and his climactic final confrontation, the new one focuses on Peter Parker the *boy* and his transformation into the high-flying arachnid that keeps the streets of New York City free of criminals and otherworldly beasts. Gone is Tobey Maguire's dark and brooding reluctant hero. Andrew Garfield's Spider-Man has his super sense of humor intact, toying with his opponents and proving why he's not only one of Marvel's most popular heroes, but the funniest as well.

Another factor creating buzz for the action-packed epic is its all-star cast, filled with some of Hollywood's most promising talent. Garfield, 28, who received accolades for his work in *The Imaginarium of Doctor Parnassus* and the Oscar-nominated Facebook drama *The Social Network*, steps into the blue-and-red skintight suit. The Brit has become a tabloid fixture thanks to his off-screen relationship with co-star Emma Stone, but that hasn't overshadowed his work. A major talking point during promotion of the film has been his daring performance. The cast is rounded out by cinema veterans Martin Sheen and Sally Field playing Uncle Ben and Aunt May respectively, as well as Denis Leary as Gwen's father George Stacy, but the cast member everyone's eyes are really on is budding screen queen Emma Stone.



The actress, who broke out in 2010's teen comedy Easy A, is coming off of a career-making year, starring in two of 2011's biggest movies—The Help and Crazy, Stupid, Love. Up next for the starlet is a reunion with former co-star Ryan Gosling in the period drama The Gangster Squad. Stone beat out many high-profile actresses for the role of Spider-Man's love interest and admits she feels very fortunate to be where she is in her career. In an interview with Tribute she said, "In this business there are lots of girls out there more talented than me. It's been a fun time and I realize how lucky I am."

Stone obviously underestimates her abilities—with a 2011 Golden Globe nomination and two 2012 People's Choice Awards—she's definitely got what it takes for a lengthy, successful career. Her legions of fans look forward to this fresh talent who will shine in any role she takes on.

MEN IN BLACK 3

Everyone's favorite secret agency is back. Except, it's not space the Men in Black are concerned with—it's time

his May, Earth's own special forces in charge of maintaining our planet as a "neutral zone" for extraterrestrials will have to scramble when one of their best agents suddenly disappears from our timeline.

The third film in the *Men In Black* series was the idea of none other than main star Will Smith.

"One night he called me and said, 'I think I have an idea for number three," director Barry Sonnenfeld revealed. The basic plot is that K suddenly disappears—J is told that he's been dead for years, so he has to go back in time to save his partner. "J sees saving K as a great opportunity to learn secrets about K—he thinks he'll find out why K is so grumpy and reserved," Sonnenfeld explains. "But as it turns out, the young Agent K is open, friendly, and interested."

It's no surprise that *Men In Black* has remained on Smith's mind long after the previous movie was released. The alien-themed series has always had a soft spot in Smith's heart.

"You can't beat the black suit," he says. "It's such powerful, iconic imagery. You put on the suit and the shades and it throws you into the mental space of the Men



in Black. It's like a childhood fantasy—you know things that the other people don't know and you've got the most important job in the world. The seven-year-old boy in me comes running out when I put the black suit on."

Men In Black 3 reunites Smith with co-star Tommy Lee Jones, who plays J's grumpy and straight-shooting partner, Agent K. Jones was excited to revisit the world he helped bring to the big screen nearly 15 years ago.


"Any time you go to work with Will Smith is going to be a happy day, and Will and Barry together make it an even happier day," Jones says. "They are wonderful people to work with."

This time, however, there isn't only one actor filling Agent K's shoes. Josh Brolin had the responsibility of portraying a younger version of the character made memorable by Jones. Imitating his recognizable voice was one aspect Brolin found somewhat challenging.

"I've seen the first film 45 or 50 times—I'm not exaggerating," says Brolin. "I'm a huge fan of the chemistry between Tommy and Will. Tommy's voice has a cadence to it that's very specific to *Men In Black*—it's very different from the way he speaks in life. I just listened to it and listened to it and listened to it until I started dreaming about it. I don't know if I got it, but my friends would tell me that I sounded like him. I'd go out to dinner, and they'd tell me, 'You're ordering like Tommy."

But how will the new film stack up against the cult-classic predecessors? Smith is looking forward to finding out how audiences rate the latest in the series. "This movie has not only aliens, but time travel, so it sets the movie in a time and a place that give it a whole new look and feel and brand new situations that are so much funnier because of the time period," Smith said. "I really believe this is the best of the three."







he evil queen fearlessly declares, "Let them come," as her castle undergoes war in the trailer for *Snow White & the Huntsman*. While on the contrary, the trailer for *Prometheus* shows the cast desperate to escape a dangerous land and an explorer cries out, "Take us home!"

Both very different scenes and very different roles played by one very famous actress, Charlize Theron.

We've seen Charlize evolve and transform herself

into characters like the innocent gorilla caretaker Jill Young in *Mighty Joe Young*,

serial killer and prostitute Aileen Wuornos in *Monster*, and the self-absorbed ghostwriter Mavis Gary in *Young Adult*. But we have never seen her like *this*.

Summer 2012 will shine a new light on the actress as she takes on huge roles in two of this year's highly-anticipated action films. First, she stars in *Snow White & the Huntsman* as the evil Queen Ravenna, who is beautiful on the outside, but vain and selfish inside. Then, she will play the enigmatic Meredith Vickers in *Prometheus*.

In the movie based on the classic tale *Snow White*, the queen sets out to capture and kill her stepdaughter, Snow White (Kristen Stewart), after learning the girl will not only be the "fairest one of all," but the kingdom's ruler. She constructs a plan to remain in power and keep her title. However, when Snow White learns of the plan she escapes into the forest, forcing Queen Ravenna to send Huntsman Eric (Chris Hemsworth) to find her. The biggest twist from the Brothers Grimm version, as well as from the Disney movie, is that Eric, along with the help of not seven, but eight dwarfs, trains Snow White in the art of self defense.

Charlize dropped out of the cast of *J. Edgar* to play the coveted role of the queen—and filming for the fairy tale movie definitely had its perks. She told *Entertainment Weekly*, "I did love being in that castle. How many times do you get to pretend you live in a giant old castle and scream at people and order them around?"

Her role as the evil queen pits her against superstar Julia Roberts, who plays the queen in another 2012 *Snow White*-based film called *Mirror*, *Mirror*. However, the roles are almost incomparable as each movie's



themes are so different. While Roberts' character is comical, Charlize's portrayal of the queen is based on intense action and graphic violence.

But the adventure for the statuesque blonde beauty doesn't end there. In fact, the journey has barely begun as she stars in *Prometheus* with a team of explorers (including Noomi Rapace and Michael Fassbender). Based on a star map, explorers on the spaceship Prometheus are in search of the origins of mankind, but instead discover

an advanced alien civilization. When they become stranded on the foreign land,

the horrors they experience force them into a battle to save the future of humanity.

In the action-horror film, Charlize plays the role of a Weyland Corporation employee sent to monitor the expedition. *Prometheus* has also been extensively compared to director Ridley Scott's *Alien* series. Referring to Sigourney Weaver's Ellen Ripley in *Alien* at Comic-Con 2011, Theron said her character could be the "new Ripley" and describes her as "a suit who slowly sheds that skin through the film."

However, at the 2011 Marrakech Film Festival, Weaver said, "I'm sure they're not trying to create a blonde Ripley or anything. [Charlize is] a wonderful actress, she'll want to do her own thing with it and not be in the shadow of the other one."

Scott has confirmed *Prometheus* was originally intended to be a prequel to *Alien*, but the decision was made to turn it into an original film that takes place in the same universe.

And there you have it. Two of the biggest movies this summer, two entirely different scripts including two distinctive roles, starring one Academy Award-winning actress.

The month of June has been taken over by the beautiful Charlize Theron, but it won't be the last we see of her. The evil queen will return, as producer Joe Roth told EW.com he plans for the fairy tale to become a trilogy. "It's meant to be the first in a series of films," he said. "This story will end, but there will be questions remaining for these three characters."



Abraham Lincoln:

Hunter Hunter

Has history ever been so wrong?

Filmmakers Timur Bekmambetov and Tim Burton work together to tell the untold story of Abraham Lincoln and his secret journal. According to them, Honest Abe was not only the President of the United States; he was and still is *Abraham Lincoln: Vampire Hunter*. Despite the title, this is not a comedy but a dark, action-packed, suspenseful horror.

Seth Grahame-Smith, the author of the original book the movie is based on, also wrote the screenplay. His book describes the life Lincoln endured after his mother's passing. As the future president learns the truth behind her death, Lincoln, known for his height, strength and signature axe, sets out on a quest of vengeance that will lead him all the way to the White House.

"Lincoln's the first and true American hero," said Grahame-Smith in an interview with Collider.com. "He's somebody who went from nothing and rose not only to the highest office of the land but saved that land."

Bekmambetov says, "We are telling the secret part of this battle. The secret part of Lincoln's life." Tellingly, Lincoln is remembered as saying, "Those who look for the bad in people will surely find it." Take what you will from that.

The film introduces us to newcomer Benjamin Walker in the role of Abraham Lincoln. "What's important is that Ben, as of now, has not been in a ton of movies and he's fresh to people," said Grahame-Smith.

As with every vampire movie, *Abraham Lincoln: Vampire Hunter* offers its own version of the bloodsuckers. However, Grahame-Smith wants to make one thing clear: "I'm not a *Twilight* hater, but I'll say this... our vampires don't sparkle. This movie puts vampires back where they belong, as bad guys, and not heartthrobs. So in this you're going to see badass vampires who'll be treated as the villains they are."

While it's important not to take this historically-based gothic movie too seriously, it could easily be the biggest surprise of the summer. "It's an honor as an American," says Walker. "I want to know that my leaders are strong and can make tough decisions... and cut some heads off."

Kristen Stewart's RISING

rom Bella to Snow White, this A-list celebrity's life may seem like a fairy tale. Kristen Stewart, best known for playing the lead in the hugely popular *Twilight* movies, had no aspiration to become famous. In a 2009 interview

Kristen said, "I don't want to be a movie star like Angelina Jolie. Nothing about being a celebrity is desirable." However, her desire to avoid celebrity status was not successful.

From the time Kristen played Jodie Foster's daughter in the 2002 film *Panic Room*, her natural talent was obvious and she was soon cast in other movies. She starred in commercial films such as Cold Creek Manor, Catch That Kid and Jumper, but also managed to fly under the radar by appearing in independent, smaller budget films such as The Cake Eaters, Fierce People, The Yellow Handkerchief and Into the Wild. With her fame, amazing roles, and list of celebrity cuties she has worked with, many thought Kristen had reached the top. However, her star only continues to rise. Not only can she now add Chris Hemsworth to the list of co-star "hotties," but she can also add Snow White & the Huntsman to her fairy tale life.

Always an artist in addition to being a star, Kristen continues to make time for indie films such as the upcoming *On the Road*, based on the Jack Kerouac novel. She'll also appear in the final installment of the Twilight series: The Twilight Saga: Breaking Dawn - Part 2. Just as in those movies, where we watched her go from clumsy teen to fiancée, then wife and mother, we've watched the rise of Kristen Stewart, from child actress to international star.



Her road to the top began shortly after she moved to Los Angeles. Kathryn was cast as a dancer in the movie remake of *Fame* and soon after, she was chosen for the sixth season of the dance series *So You Think You Can Dance*. The weekly TV exposure brought her into the limelight.

With no acting experience under her belt, she was reluctant to try out for a speaking role in *Step Up Revolution*, but went to the audition anyway. "I left thinking that I'd embarrassed myself and it was horrible and I definitely wasn't getting a callback," Kathryn admits.

When she was cast in the lead role of Emily, Kathryn couldn't believe it. "I had no idea that that was in my path," she told *Tribute*. "Acting was something I was interested in, but I never took enough time away from dancing to actually pursue it."

How difficult was it being a first time actor on such a big project?

KM: With my experience on *So You Think You Can Dance* and some of the other things that I've been a part of, I've had a little bit of acting training without even realizing it. On the show you're put in situations where you're telling a story every single week and because of that, I felt I was able to connect and tap into those emotions inside of me.

Have you seen the previous Step Up films?

KM: The first *Step Up* was always one of my favourite dance movies. As a kid, I'd watch those films and think, "I want to be that girl." But I never, ever imagined that I would actually be that girl, so it is a blessing and I'm so grateful.

Would you like to do more acting after this?

KM: I just enrolled in an acting class. You know, acting helps my dancing as well. And I think dancing helps acting. So, I'm training and I'm auditioning and I don't really know what's next for me, but I'm trying to be ready for any opportunities that come.

How did you get into motivational speaking?

KM: Public speaking was actually one of my biggest fears, but I was asked to be a motivational speaker because people liked what they saw of me on *So You Think You Can Dance*. They thought I had what it took so I chose to get past my fear and I just told my story and let audiences know that just because your name has been built up or you're on TV it doesn't make you any greater. You know, we're still all the same, we're still all women and we're beautiful and we're loved and we're worth something and success is not what you do, it's how you do it.

The actor will be stripping down for the ladies and then gearing up for battle.

hat do G.I. Joes and male strippers have in common? One very hot actor and his very fit body, that's what. Channing Tatum stars in not one, but two big blockbusters this summer and while the roles are worlds apart, they both come from a personal place for the actor—albeit in two very different ways.

Channing co-producing. "[Soderbergh] wanted to know what it was like. That's what everybody wants to know," Channing explained in an interview with Collider.com. "Everybody wants to know what the inside of a male strip club looks like." He promises this film will answer all your questions. "If you ever wanted to know what it's like to be a male stripper, this is it."

So whether you're looking for action-packed, adrenaline-pumped fight scenes, or a fun comedy with good looking guys taking their shirts off, Channing Tatum's got you covered.


