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

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
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# LOVE, AND OTHER DILEMMAS

Robert Pattinson, Kristen Stewart and Taylor Lautner return to fight old vendettas and heartache in *The Twilight Saga: New Moon*.

he success of the *Twilight* series—both the books and now the movies—is an incredibly exciting phenomenon. The first movie was an instant success thanks to a built-in fan base from the novels written by Stephenie Meyer. It may have begun with teenage girls, but soon their mothers, brothers and boyfriends were raving about *Twilight*'s new breed of vampires as well.

The sequel based on the second book in the series, *The Twilight Saga: New Moon*, promises more action and special effects, as well as the inclusion of A-list actors such as Dakota Fanning who stars as the cunning vamp Jane. Here's the basic gist of the story, and if you're not already a fanpire (that is, *Twilight* fan), this is sure to pique your interest.

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In the first movie, Bella Swan (Kristen Stewart) and Edward Cullen (Robert Pattinson) fell in love, despite the fact that she's human and he's a vampire. Although he's completely in love with her, there's always a chance she could get hurt if he loses control. *New Moon* starts off with Bella's birthday, and no matter how much she likes to downplay special occasions, Edward wants to celebrate her birthday with his entire family.

However, there's always a risk when Bella visits the Cullens. Although the family members limit themselves to animal blood, Edward's brother Jasper is still a danger. Prior to joining the family, he'd feasted on many humans and the temptation is still strong for him.

While opening her gifts, Bella gets a paper cut. Jasper flies out of control at the scent and sight of her blood, and although the others restrain him, it's enough to make Edward decide that his presence in Bella's life is too big a risk.


He begins to withdraw from her and when he makes an abrupt departure, Bella feels as if her heart is broken—no, more than broken, ripped from her chest. There's an empty feeling and she's not sure she'll ever feel whole again.

To placate her father, and in an attempt to seem as if she's back to normal, Bella starts hanging out with Jacob, a friend from the nearby reservation. Jacob has feelings for Bella, but they've been unrequited, since Edward has always been paramount to Bella. Now, with Edward gone, Jacob pulls out all the stops in an effort to take his place in her heart. Taylor Lautner, who plays Jacob, described the relationship to *Metro World News* this way: "Jacob's love for Bella is really intense. He will always be there for Bella, no matter what. Even if she's with another guy...or a vampire!"

But there's something about Jacob that neither Bella nor Jacob know at first, and when he finds out, it changes just about everything—including his relationship with Bella.



To prepare for his role, Lautner, who was just 16 when the first movie was filmed, had to bulk up to match his character's description in the books. There was even talk



that he would be replaced by an older actor, but thanks to his dedication, he was hired back for the sequel. He told *Interview* magazine: "As soon as I finished filming *Twilight*, I knew I had to get to work right away; there could be no waiting involved. The day I finished *Twilight*, I came home and started bulking up. For *New Moon*, I'm 30 pounds heavier than I was in *Twilight*."

Director Chris Weitz says he always felt Lautner would be able to continue the role in the sequel, telling MTV it wasn't a difficult decision: "[Taylor] knew the character, and he embodied the character—as people are going to see in the movie."

For fans who are worried that Edward's absence means Robert Pattinson won't figure much in the sequel, Weitz assures: "You'll see quite a lot of Rob in the film, but [he'll be] seen subjectively, through Bella's eyes. It's also in dreams that she has of him as well," adding, "It strikes this very fine balance between too much Rob and too little Rob... Well, I know for a lot of people there's no such thing as too much Rob. But we've got a nice dose of Taylor to sweeten any Rob deficiencies."

# A FAMILY AFFAIR

Nikki Reed, Kellan Lutz and Jackson Rathbone dish about the Cullen Family and their vampire ways in *New Moon*.

n New Moon, Carlisle (Peter Facinelli), Esme (Elizabeth Reaser), Edward (Robert Pattinson), Rosalie (Nikki Reed), Emmett (Kellan Lutz), Alice (Ashley Greene) and Jasper (Jackson Rathbone) are still keeping up their "vegetarian" ways, but when Bella opens a birthday gift and gets a paper cut, the sweet scent of her blood compels Jasper to lunge at her. Although it was a mere vampire mistake, Edward is convinced she is no longer safe in their

presence. This pivotal scene in *New Moon* leaves Edward no choice but to demand that his coven disperse and cut themselves off from Bella, including himself.


"For me, it was a chance to really explore the animalistic side of Jasper, because throughout the first film in *Twilight* I've been holding back and kind of absorbing information and holding back my natural instincts to attack. And so in *New Moon* I get the chance to get a little whiff of Bella's blood and go full tilt and attack her," Rathbone says. "It was a fun scene to shoot."

Maybe Rathbone was a little too excited to submit to his vampire urges, because filming that scene got a little

rough. "I had to run into Rob [Pattinson] and then I had to jump back because it's supposed to look like he throws me back," Rathbone explains. "So I run into Rob and I jump myself backwards and I was supposed to land onto a stunt pad, but the stunt men who were following me got caught on the stairs so I landed on the ground. It looks really good, though. I had to take the heat for the movie!"

Not only did Rathbone stick his neck out for the part, but also so did the entire cast when they took on the roles to begin with. The fan base from Stephenie Meyer's beloved books brought on some pressure to fulfill their fantasies and some unexpected, crazy fan pandemonium resulted. "I really try not to focus on it," admits Reed. "It's really easy to get caught up in the negative and the positive, and I think both extremes are unhealthy and not the right approach."

Adds Lutz, "I think we all just wanted to make *Twilight* for the fans as best we could, and a lot of the fans are die-hards. They have such a vision for how things should



be conveyed or about the cast members. But we got such satisfaction in knowing they loved it and saw it so many times—it was such a weight off of our shoulders."


And although the Cullen family of vamps can't even stand the smell of a wolf in their presence, Lutz has nothing but praise for co-stars, who've all become close friends, including Taylor Lautner, who plays Jacob the werewolf. "Taylor is such a movie star!" Lutz says. "He really worked so hard and this is really his movie. He just shines and people are going to see it over and over again with everything that he put the time into, from working out to the acting to building his relationship with Kristen [Stewart].

"Seeing what director Chris Weitz did with the werewolves could have gone one of two ways: it could have been very cartoon-y looking or very real, and it's the latter of the two. It just looks great and it terrifies me! It's a great movie."

But what's a vampire without its fangs? "I think it's actually a lot cooler that we don't wear fangs, we don't need 'em!" Rathbone says. "In other vampire films, those little wusses, they need fangs. I don't know if you've taken a look closely at Rob Pattinson's smile. He's already got those canines!" According to Reed, if the Cullens had fangs they wouldn't be able to hide amongst humans. "We've already worked so hard fitting in with the

rest of society," she says about their characters. "If we had fangs, it would be outrageous and unbelievable."

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n New Moon, Taylor Lautner's character Jacob Black has some growing pains—literally. He soon realizes his true destiny is to become a wolf, and Jacob—along with his Quileute tribe's wolf pack, which includes its leader Sam (Chaske Spencer), Paul (Alex Meraz), Embry (Kiowa Gordon) and Jared (Bronson Pelletier)—takes on a much greater role in New Moon compared to Twilight.

"We've got Sam Uley, who leads the pack," Lautner recently explained. "We all follow him. He's the alpha. And then we've got Jared and Paul—Jared is a funny guy, a real jokester, and Bronson [Pelletier], who plays him, is the same way in real life, so he does that well. Paul is the hothead. He goes out with my girl, and I tear him to shreds. And then there's Kiowa [Gordon] who plays Embry, and he's my best friend."

Director Chris Weitz also said that each of these actors had to have papers that proved their native heritage, which was important for authenticity. Plus, they had to be in good physical shape, not just Lautner.

"Our trainer was one of the warriors in 300," Meraz told *Tribute* during a phone interview from the Vancouver set of *Eclipse*. "You know, all of us threw up every day because it was so intense. We only had two weeks, really. We had to come into it with a good enough build and then just kind of mold it for the role, but it was good. It really helped bond the whole pack because we're


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supporting each other and kind of teasing each other if you couldn't lift the heavy weights. It helped mold the friendship and the brotherhood."

But despite being a new member of the *Twilight Saga* crew, Meraz said they all eventually bonded in some way. "Well, most of my time was spent with the other newbies. We all shot together, trained together and we relied on each other for advice. Meeting the rest of the cast was great and they kind of warned us about some of the craziness."

Although *Twilight* fans are hardcore in that they want the movies to stay true to the beloved novels, Meraz took it all in stride. "I was definitely nervous but in an anxious, anticipation sort of way. I really wanted to work on this."

# INTRODUCING THE VOLTURI

Dakota Fanning and Michael Sheen join the cast of *New Moon* as its newest vampire members with an agenda of their own.

lthough they may be members of the supernatural world, vampires, although lethal to humans, have their own governing body. In the *Twilight* series, they are known as the Volturi. We finally meet them in *New Moon*, but discover that although they are there to protect their kind from exposure to the human world, they also have their own motives for keeping themselves in power.

The Volturi reside in Volterra, Italy. They are regarded as the royal family of vampires because they have existed for over three thousand years and act as a governing body to all vampires of the world, enforcing the rule that the existence of vampires must remain a secret from humans.

Founded by Aro (Michael Sheen), the coven includes the prominent members Marcus (Christopher Heyerdahl), Caius (Jamie Campbell Bower), Jane (Dakota Fanning), Alec (Cameron Bright) and Demetri (Charlie Bewley).

The Volturi will send members of their guard to ensure stability in the world, including eradicating the Immortal children (which are illegal to create in the vampire world) and cleaning up after vampires who become too overzealous in their killings, thereby attracting attention to their existence. If they sense a vampire has a special power, they try to recruit him/her into their coven to help make it more powerful. Carlisle Cullen once stayed with the coven

Another leader, Marcus, has the power to sense relationships, and therefore find people's weaknesses.

#### Jane and Alec

Jane has the ability to make her prey believe that they are feeling pain, therefore making them more susceptible to her. Alec has the power to cut off all senses, rendering his prey unable to see, hear or feel anything.

#### Demetri (Charlie Bewley)

As a member of the guard, Demetri is considered the best tracker in the vampire world. He can track people down by discerning the tenor of their minds, making their actions easy to predict.


as a guest, but due to his desire to avoid harming humans he left and established his own coven.

Seeing that as a valuable asset to the coven, they try to convince Edward to join them. Realizing that he simply cannot go on without Bella, Edward believes he has no choice but to expose himself to the world, so that the Volturi will have no choice but to kill him.

# INTERVIEW WITH A VAMPIRE

## ROBERT PATTINSON dishes on playing

Edward Cullen in New Moon.

n the upcoming *The Twilight Saga: New Moon*, Bella Swan (Kristen Stewart) is devastated by the abrupt departure of her vampire love, Edward Cullen (Robert Pattinson), but her spirit is rekindled by her growing friendship with the irresistible Jacob Black (Taylor Lautner). Suddenly, her loyalties are tested.

Although Pattinson has become one of the biggest stars on the planet, the British actor seems to shy away from the spotlight. But despite the paparazzi following his every move, Pattinson insists that his life remains cool—unlike his vampire alter ego, Edward, who is always in need of rescuing by his true love Bella.

#### How has your life changed since the last film?

PATTINSON: I don't know. I'd like to think that I haven't changed that much. I think I look down a lot. There's something wrong with my neck [laughs]. No, it's kind of extraordinary. I don't think that any of us expected any of this to happen and especially that it seems to keep building and building, the magnitude of this franchise.

# What would you say have been the highs and the lows of this whole experience?

PATTINSON: I still think it's still so young, to me anyway. I can't claim anything to be a low. I pretty much live an almost identical life apart from being recognized. That's not exactly the worst thing in the world.

# According to the story, Edward leaves. Will fans be disappointed not to see you as much?

PATTINSON: They won't be disappointed. If he [Edward] doesn't go, you can't miss him, and that's what this whole movie is about: that empty, completely dark place where Edward is absent.

#### Has the experience of working with a new director, Chris Weitz, changed the vibe?

**PATTINSON:** It wasn't just the director that made this one different. It was different because we kind of knew what type of animal that we were dealing with. I play much more of a supporting role in this one. I started three weeks after they started shooting, and I did a lot of my

first scenes doing the apparition scenes. That's a lot of me doing maybe one word. It was actually one of the most relaxing jobs that I've ever done! Chris has a really peaceful presence and I got on really well with him. I pretty much had a stress-free job for three months. It was great for me. All the pressure was on Taylor!

#### What's your favorite scene or moment?

**PATTINSON:** I think my breakup scene was my favorite scene. I mean, hopefully it'll come off as having quite a few more levels than the relationship in *Twilight*. It was interesting. It was like a five-page-long dialogue scene. It completely bypasses all the supernatural elements of the story.


#### Why do people love vampires and vampire stories?

PATTINSON: When I looked at it from the beginning I never saw it as a vampire story. When I try to play it, I try to eliminate the vampire element as much as I can and just kind of see it as a tool to make their relationship a little more fraught. Right after the audition I found myself kind of bizarrely invested in the story, and I hadn't even read the books at that point. I've kind of gotten more and more attached to it. They definitely have some kind of power.

# Which of the novels is your favorite, and which movie are you most enthused about working on?

PATTINSON: I think that New Moon was my favorite book. In New Moon—the way that I read it anyway— Edward's just so humbled. It's a character that is looking at Bella and thinking that he loves something too much but he can't be around. He deliberately starts breaking up their relationship, which I think is a very relatable thing and I think is very kind of painful. Yeah, the fight sequence at the end, Bella ends up saving Edward as she does in every single one of the books. So it's really funny how everyone looks at Edward as the hero, and yet the damsel in distress is continually saving him. I think he really realizes that in New Moon.

# **BELLA'S DILEMMA**

Actress KRISTEN STEWART talks about *New Moon* and how her character, Bella Swan, is torn between Edward and Jacob.

ust when she's found the love of her life, Bella (Kristen Stewart) is shocked when Edward (Robert Pattinson) abruptly decides to leave her. He says it's for her own safety and believes she would be better off without him and his family—one of whom, Jasper, almost made a meal out of her (accidentally, of course).

*New Moon* really kicks things into gear and Stewart admits that it was a highly emotional experience for her this time around and that she strongly connected with friend Taylor Lautner during their scenes.

Bella's story arc really starts to develop. Was it more difficult to prepare for the role this time around?

STEWART: I wouldn't say that one was more difficult than the other. This is a severely emotional movie. That's the one big difference. This movie is not about discovery or falling in love, which is sort of just an intense emotion, but there are low and high points for her, too. She's a manic-depressive, basically. To have a character be able to pull her out of that is a hefty feat, which I think we pulled off. But for me, like, I don't know. There was no difference. It was just sort of heavier and it was more to think about. It's a more mature part strictly because she's older and she has more to deal with.

Why do you think people are so drawn to this story? STEWART: It's just like any movie. You could say that about anything: you relate to the characters. I always say that it's because it's first-person narrative and you're so very much inside of her head that it's closer to home. You feel like it's not happening to someone else—you feel like it's sort of happening to you.

Does having a male director give this particular chapter of the saga a different stylistic or thematic sensibility? STEWART: I don't think so. People always want to know the differences between directors. Every single person is different, just like any human being would approach a different project. He (director Chris Weitz) gave us all time to really go through the dark things that we had to go through, and made us all feel really safe to do it. You can't work for someone unless you think they care. I feel like Chris would have done anything for either of us on the movie.



Everyone talks about Edward and Robert Pattinson. Can you speak to what makes Taylor so interesting? STEWART: Yeah. He's very honest. I don't know—he's just very open. I mean, Edward and Bella are just so tense all the time, and Jacob and Bella are just so open and free, and they can talk to each other about anything, you know? And I would definitely say that we have a relationship similar to that. I'm not like that with everyone either. It's so rare for me to be able to do that. I don't know what it really means, but it definitely says something about him. He puts people at ease.


What story out of the series do you like most?

**STEWART:** I liked *New Moon* just in terms of how far I can push myself within the series. I feel like after *New Moon* it's sort of smooth sailing for her. She's very, very solid and content and happy. But in the second one she's nothing, literally just lost. I've got to find her again.

Are you coping better with this craziness, or are you still finding this intense?

STEWART: I'm getting better at, like, the craziness that everybody thinks would be the difficult part to deal with—which is loads of people and stuff like that. That's not what I've ever had a problem with. But the self-evaluation in interviews, and self-definition...I don't know myself very well. You know what I mean? I always take it very seriously. I'm doing that less and less, which is maybe not such a good thing.

# JACOB THE WOLF

TAYLOR LAUTNER makes his mark as the new wolf who guns for Bella's heart in *New Moon*.

aylor Lautner certainly steps up his game in *New Moon*. Not only did he gain weight and muscle to play an extremely big and tall wolf, he says he's excited that his character has initiated a love triangle between his character Jacob, Bella Swan (Kristen Stewart) and Edward (Robert Pattinson).

It's hard to believe that Jacob could wedge himself between the lovestruck pair, but when Bella is devastated by the abrupt departure of her vampire love, Edward Cullen (Pattinson), she suddenly finds herself pulled into Jacob's arms.

What was your personal transformation like for this role? LAUTNER: When I was filming *Twilight* I knew that Jacob's character changed a lot so if I wanted to continue portraying him correctly I had a lot of work ahead of myself. So as soon as I finished filming *Twilight* I started hitting the gym. I got a personal trainer. I started eating a lot of food—good food of course: proteins, good carbs and I cut out sugars. It was a lot of work but it was definitely worth it.

#### How has your life changed since the last film?

LAUTNER: I think that another thing that's changed for me, that's kind of obvious, is the schedule has gotten busier, doing publicity and working on other things. It's crazy. None of us saw it coming. It's definitely been a ride for all of us.

# How does this massive embracing of Team Edward and Team Jacob play into your performance?

LAUTNER: I think that everything is kind of crazy about this, and that's why we love it so much and that's why the fans do as well. But yeah, there are definitely a lot of fans who are on two separate teams. It gets me a little nervous because I'm trying to live up to the fans' expectations and trying to represent Team Jacob in the right way. I don't want to disappoint them, so that's why I worked so hard to not only mentally and emotionally get ready, but to also physically change as well for this role, because this guy becomes some pretty good competition.

# When you saw yourself morph on screen for the first time, what went through your mind?

LAUTNER: I thought they did a pretty good job with the wolf transformation. I'm excited that there



are werewolves involved now, because the werewolves definitely step up the action in the movie. There is double the action in this movie than there was before and there's also a different dynamic. Now, it's not just this romance between a human girl and a vampire, but it's the beginning of a love triangle and that's so exciting.

#### What scene stands out for you?

LAUTNER: I have a lot of favorite scenes so that's a really difficult question for me. I like a lot of the cool action scenes I get to do because I just had a lot of fun with those. But one of them is a really small scene that I just thought was kind of cute. It was the scene where I walk up to Bella's door and say goodbye to her and I'm going off to fight in the woods and she's worried. She's scared for me.

## Which of the novels in the series resonates the most for you as a reader?

LAUTNER: My favorite book was actually *Eclipse*. The action levels continue to build in this series. I enjoy that, but also the fact that Bella and Jacob's friendship grows in *New Moon*. But in *Eclipse*, it's actually the three of them physically together and we have to team up and make this decision to try and be friends to protect Bella. I think that is like the ultimate high point of the series, where it's the love triangle in *Eclipse*.

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Long before Robert Pattinson sparkled his way onto the big screen as the brooding Edward Cullen in the *Twilight Saga* movies, audiences have been captivated by the seductive world of vampires. It's been 112 years since Irish writer Bram Stoker penned the famous novel *Dracula*, yet from literature to movies and TV, we still can't seem to live without the undead.

The image of vampires has changed quite a bit over the past century. Bela Lugosi's slick-haired, cape-wearing Count Dracula in the 1931 version of *Dracula* is vastly different from Gary Oldman's modern reinvention of the character in 1992, but both are rooted firmly in Stoker's classic tale. Vampires may still be associated with coffins, bats and bad Transylvanian accents on Halloween, but on the big screen, they've come a long way.


So what is it that draws us to vampires so much? Well, that depends on what movie you're watching. Sometimes

vampire movies are designed to scare us—think Nosferatu (1922), Salem's Lot (1979) and 30 Days of Night (2007). Or if you're into campy vampire flicks, there's Buffy the Vampire Slayer (1992). But perhaps the vampires we love the most are the ones that are not only immortal, but downright sexy, too. From Tom Cruise's incarnation of the vampire Lestat and Brad Pitt's Louis in Interview with the Vampire (1994), to Kate Beckinsale's leather catsuit-clad Selene in Underworld (2003), being hundreds of years old never looked so good. Even Kiefer Sutherland's platinum mullet in The Lost Boys (1987) had a certain charm...(hey, it was the '80s).

Vampires have been a hit on the small screen, too. *Buffy* the Vampire Slayer turned a whole new generation on to the genre, as did its spin-off, Angel. And these days, vamp shows are ruling the small screen, thanks to *True Blood* and *The Vampire Diaries*. Needless to say, it's a bloody great time.


